What is meant by "Build back better"?

- UN use the term for their disaster recovery process:
 - Recovery
 - Rehabilitation
 - Reconstruction
- To increase the resilience of nations and communities.



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I wondered about the theme of today...Build Back Better and was curious to understand what it meant and where it came from. Doing a Google search (other search engines are available, including Ecosia where searching helps to plant trees) I found it is a term used by the United Nations General Assembly 2016 to describe their disaster recovery process - the use of the recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction phases after a disaster to increase the resilience of nations and communities.

I wondered if the Pandemic is being classed as a disaster. I found one country who was saying it was, some say it is an emergency crisis and some just say it is a pandemic!



Is the pandemic a "Disaster"?

It has certainly led to:

- a disproportionate social and economic impact on women and girls
- an increase in gender-based violence
- Interrupted schooling for millions of girls worldwide



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The fact that the pandemic is having a disproportionate and devastating social and economic impact on women and girls with skyrocketing levels of gender-related violence placing the lives of many more women and girls at risk and millions of teenage girls around the world staying out of school affecting their education and the possibility of achieving their potential and life choices? Is that a disaster? It is being called a pandemic within the pandemic...

I wondered what could Build Back Better look like regarding these issues and the other issues women face regarding pay and benefits inequality, perhaps its access to health care, unpaid child and family care, cash and loans equality.

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These issues have (always) been central to Soroptimists and what we have taken action on. Also the fact that Soroptimists have continued to be active in these areas over the last months is testament to us knowing how important they are. Now that the world's focus is also on these issues — maybe this is a great opportunity for us.

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UN Secretary General said, the goal will be to build a better future in which the world can take the opportunity of an economic reset to ensure the rights to life, dignity, and security for everyone. Moreover, as the pandemic has shown the world who is doing the work that really matters, including nurses, teachers and care workers, we might end the inequities of unpaid care work and create new economic models that work for everyone. "Recovering better" must expand its reach beyond governments. The private sector, academia, institutions of all kinds, and civil society must be fully engaged.
