2020 was heralded with much promise and great expectations. The UN was turning 75.-75 years of relentless service to the global community. It was 25 years since the historic Women's Conference in Beijing. It was here that the Document Beijing Platform for Action was released—and it remains the strongest blue print for women's struggle for gender equality.....

Its 20 years since the UN Security Council passed Resolution 1325 – a landmark instrument for women's meaningful participation in peace processes.

UN Women formed 10 years ago- an agency, set up to

focus solely on gender equality issues.

5 years ago the Sustainable Development Goals were brought to the stage and accepted unanimously by member states- as a collective thrust to the future.

2020 also marks the beginning of the Decade of Action. It kicks off a reaffirmation of global commitment towards achieving the 2030 agenda. With only 10 years left to deliver the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), it is more important than ever for the global community to mobilise for accelerated action.



Brought to a halt by a protean virus-that's challenging scientists and the medical community. The pandemic is reversing decades of uneven development progress, making achievement of the goals "even more challenging," according to U.N. "The Sustainable Development Goals Report 2020," released. An estimated 71 million people are expected to be pushed back into extreme poverty in 2020.

Health care systems have been over-stretched and the staff overworked. Women are more likely to be exposed to the virus given their traditional caregiving roles and participation in the healthcare workforce. Every disaster and crisis, impacts women and girls unequally, as every response includes a woman- as the first responder.

The steep spike in gender –based violence doesn't help peace. As stay-athome orders expand, women with violent partners increasingly find themselves isolated from the people and resources that can help them. Domestic violence shelters are reaching capacity, or unable to take new victims due to lockdown and social distancing measures. Psychosocial support for women and girls affected by the outbreak, gender-based violence survivors, must be considered essential services



The grave economic downturn impacts women as they hold the majority of jobs within heavily-effected sectors as those within retail, the service industry, education, and more. Women are already experiencing higher rates of job loss than men. The closure of small businesses is a further blow



LOSS OF EDUCATION

We were already living a learning crisis before the pandemic. With the spread of the coronavirus, the learning crisis will be even deeper – the baseline from which we need to accelerate and improve learning is now even more challenging.

The COVID-19 pandemic has created the largest disruption of education systems in history, affecting nearly 1.6 billion learners in more than 190 countries and all continents. It has highlighted the inequities that made the "old normal" difficult for so many — especially women and girls. The huge *Class divide* evident in learning has created new challenges. Learning losses also threaten to extend beyond this generation and erase decades of progress. The enormity of preventing a learning crisis from becoming a generational catastrophe is real

According to the World Economic Forum the majority of the world's 25.9 million refugees and 41.3 million internally displaced persons are in developing countries. Persons displaced internally and across borders are at risk living in cramped quarters hence social isolation in not an option. Closure of borders and internal travel restrictions has placed migrant labourer in harm's way and as they suffer work losses.


This crisis has shown the need to build back better, and create the appropriate support and infrastructure for women — which includes having them at the table for coronavirus response,
