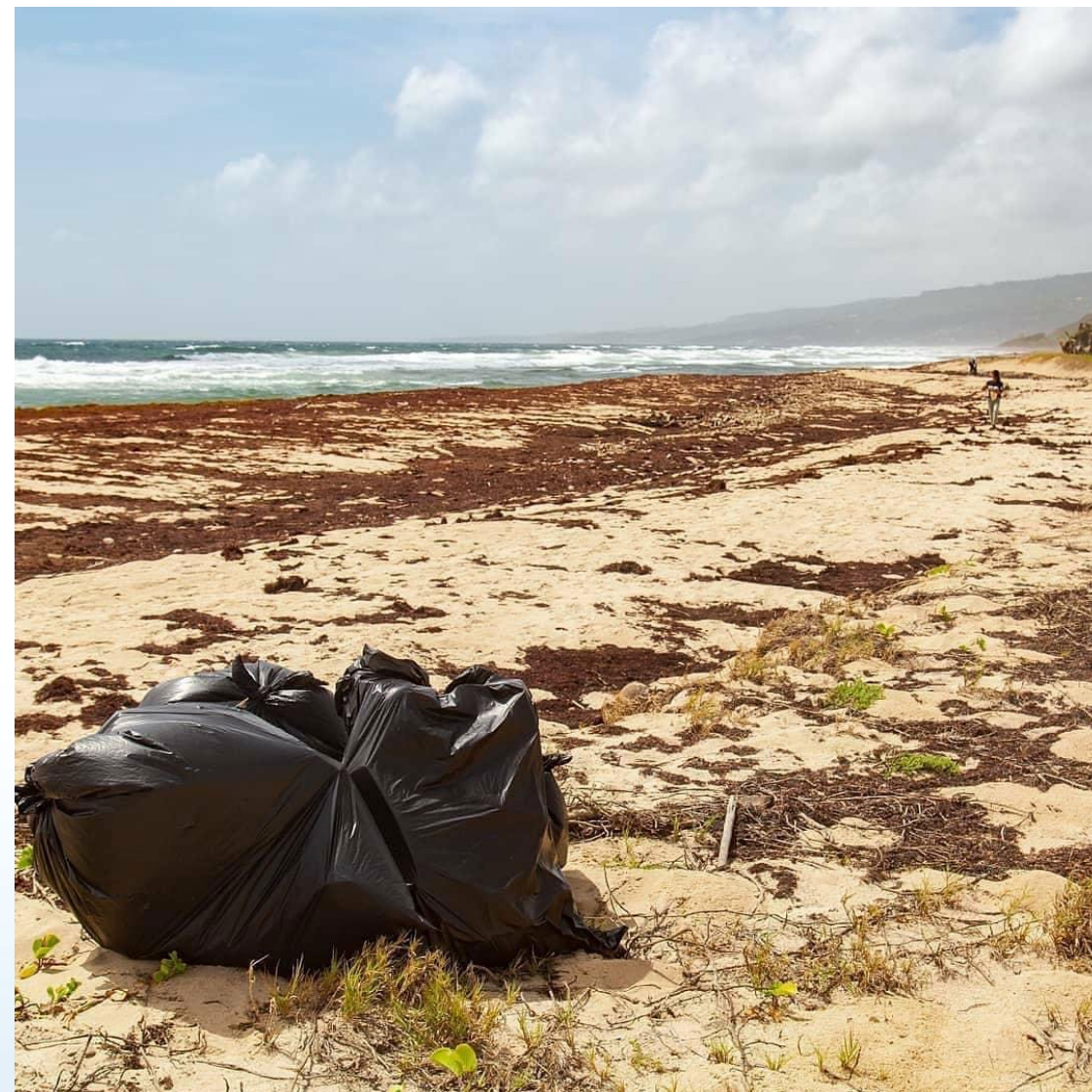


# Climate Change and Women

'Sea'ing Efforts are made to Reverse the Damage – SI BARBADOS

- The Walkers Beach in Barbados is an important nesting site for Leather Back turtle which is an endangered species.
- SI Barbados conducted a beach clean at Walkers Beach to commemorate World Environment Day 2021.
- 75 bags of trash weighing approximately 25lbs each (total 1875 lbs approximately) was collected.





## Planting herbs and plants at Coco Hill Forest



- SI Barbados commemorated International Women's Day 2022 by planting more than 150 herbs and plants in Coco Hill Forest in St. Joseph, which was once a sugar plantation and has suffered more than 3 centuries of over farming and soil erosion
- The project provided insight on the importance of regenerative work on the environment and the community. Members were introduced to the fundamentals of soil preparation and planting.
