Originally worn on a blue ribbon with silver name badges of the name and date of each Past President. When ribbon became full it was changed to a heavy silver chain and silver badges were displayed in a presentation box.

Have replicated Insignia in a cross stitch version with a slightly more modern take and replaced dolphins with fish as easier to do. Have also included a cockle shell that is at the top of our Past President's badge, We also decided to incorporate the New Brighton lighthouse which is so dominant as you enter or leave the River Mersey.

We have no records of how the original design came about but Wallasey was very much a seafaring area. Perhaps a reason for the sailing ship. It was also known as the coast of wreckers and smugglers and still has underground tunnels that were used to hide and transport their bounty.
