### Treasurers report

Charity £1,714.84 of which £1619 is for Brain Tumour Research.

Members were reminded that Joan would like all members' subscriptions for  $1^{st}$  April  $2019 - 31^{st}$  March 2020 by the AGM on  $21^{st}$  March. Members paying monthly by direct debit should ensure the amount is increased to £7.75 per month for the following year and settle any underpayment for the coming year. Members (tax payers only) who have not filled out a <u>Gift Aid form for the capitation fee to sigbi</u> should do so to allow federation to claim back the tax now that sigbi has Charitable Status. We now hold 31 shares in No 63.

# Programme Action

Chris reported that Claire had sent 15.05kg of ring pulls to the Purple Community Fund. This was equivalent to 50,741 items and had a potential monetary value of £1,505.
