I wish to thank all of the Directors of the Board for their unstinting work and their diligence and the Shareholders for their continued support of number 63. Best wishes to you all.





We have two meeting rooms for hire for meetings, events, or conferences for **business** or **personal** use.




**1. Dining room**, which is available after 10.30 am, and can be used for up to 14 board room style or 16 cabaret style.

This is a mixed secondary school with academy status providing education for pupils aged 11-18 years. The winnings came at the right time to enable us to sponsor both participants.

We all met for dinner on that first night which was followed by us seeing a wonderful and innovative production of Guys and Dolls at the Bridge Theatre, both thanks to Ruth.

Friday was filled firstly with a visit to the bronze sculpture by Marc and Gillis beside Paddington Train Station, where large bronze animal figures sit at a picnic table, then the Charles Dickens Museum (via the new Elizabeth Line).



After lunch, we went to Marble Arch to see Frameless <u>https://frameless.com</u> the marvellous multi-sensory immersive art exhibition. We were surrounded by well-known masterpieces at this multidimensional venue, which uses motion sensors and virtual art projection technology to bring works of art to life as you navigate the rooms. Showcasing no less than 42 different digital interpretations of 29 of the world's most iconic artists, including masterpieces from the likes of Cezanne, Kandinsky, Monet, Dalí, Van Gogh, Signac, Canaletto, Turner, Rembrandt and Klimt, to name just a few, all set to a score of classical and contemporary music. The interpretation of Turner's 'The Fighting Temeraire' moving through the storm was most impressive and we were truly transported.

Saturday was a walking day through Kensington to visit St Mary Abbots Church, the parish church of Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Oscar Wilde, amongst many other famous figures. The earliest record is a mention of a church in the Doomsday Book, making it the site of the first church in Kensington and a place of worship for over 1000 years. The present parish church was designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott, possibly the most famous and sought after architect of his day.



We also made our way through Portobello Market, a vibrant place on Saturdays. Some members explored other museums and galleries, taking a stroll through Hyde Park (immediately opposite Number 63, our Soroptimist hotel) as well as going to an opera.

A very successful and most enjoyable trip away and in good company was the consensus. Here's to a repeat next year!
