News of members Edith went to visit Irene on Sunday, where they went and enjoyed the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Street Party, which was being held in her street in Murrayfield.

Minutes of last Business Meeting 11 May 2022

Actions/Matters Arising:

- Photographs had been taken of those who were wearing orange on 25 May.
- Urge the UK Government to ratify the Istanbul Convention re action on violence against women and domestic violence. Tookits had not yet materialised.
- Remind everyone of Action Day against single use plastics on 16 July.
- Gari agreed to include the relevant dates in the next edition of SIEnna.
- It was reported that there was little pressure in the courts on Mondays from women who had been arrested over the week-end, so collecting provisions for them would be unnecessary.
- Pat B would add the articles in the local Press about her on the Club's Facebook page.
- The Syrian delicacies, which had been arranged for the meeting at the end of May, did not materialise. Perhaps they could be arranged for another meeting.

Lindsey proposed adopting the Minutes and Clephane seconded

Correspondence:

All of it had been circulated to members in advance via email.

Treasurer's Report:

Myint Su reported that she had paid the honorarium to the speakers from the last meeting, to enable them to buy "Model UN", a book, which had been produced by the UN. It was agreed to increase the amount paid to speakers as an honorarium from £20 to £30.

She also reported that she had given the Hostel a list of next year's meeting dates. However, there is some doubt about whether the Hostel Meeting room would be available to the Club from February 2023, which may mean that the Club may have to find another venue.

Programme Action:

Liz noted that Nikki and Lindsey had visited Castleview Primary School that morning, where the Club had sponsored trees to be planted to create a school orchard. Photographs of their visit had already been circulated to members via e mail.

She reported that there had been a regional PA Meeting on 2 May. Other themes were Recycling and Women leaving Custody. The forthcoming Misogyny Bill, which is going through Holyrood, might be a subject for advocacy, but this has to be discussed with the Club's Advocacy Group.

Membership:

Anna reported that Marianne was resigning her membership from the Club, as she has had to give up her work and return home to Tanzania for family reasons. Anna hoped that she might re-join on her return to the UK. She also reported that Patricia C is no longer an official member. SIGBI would now have to be updated; 19 full, 1 linked and 2 honorary members.

She proposed to invite prospective members to the Summer Social event at Saughton Park on 25 June.

She also stated that Maureen Maguire, International President of SI, wants to set up a Young Persons' Forum, of which more details are awaited.

She reported that SIGBI are advertising for a Commonwealth Connections' ambassador which may be a good source for Maureen's Young Persons Forum. There is also a webinar on 22 June on how to start an eClub. Nikki agreed to attend, thinking that this might be something which could be done with UN House.

Ballots for SIGBI

Pat Black reported that SIGBI are finding it difficult to fill leadership roles involving strategic leadership of SIGBI. She reported that there is intensive training and ex-

directors mentor new leaders and besides self-development is part of being a Soroptimist. The Club agreed to the 5 nominations for the 5 vacancies. Pat officially recorded a potential conflict of interest if she were to vote as she had been involved in the interviewing of some of the candidates. Pat abstained from the voting.

Key updates/ Points for Discussion/

Decisions:

It was reported that the Public Policy Exchange would be running a webinar on Ukrainian refugees in the UK. This would enable interested parties to discuss the problems/hurdles, which would have to be overcome in trying to help them. It would also be discussing safeguarding. It was unclear whether there would be anything of particular relevance to the Scottish situation. Winifred K volunteered to participate on the Club's behalf and it was agreed that her fee (£99) should be paid from the Club's Legacy fund.

Reports by exception/as required:

Clephane reported that she thoroughly enjoyed the Syrian meal, which was held at St. Peter's Church on 14 May with the charity, Building Bridges as the sponsor.

Programme:

Alison explained that she and Nikki would be meeting sometime in early July to discuss the programme for next year. In the meantime, she asked for any member who had any ideas/suggestions for speakers to contact her.

Representative Updates:

Scotland South:

There was a report on the recent meeting, which was held on 28 May. The venue at Strathclyde University was agreed to be excellent. There were 3 speakers, Pat Black, Agnes Tolmie from the Scottish Womens' Convention and Christine McKelvie MSP. It was reported that the Misogyny Bill is currently going through Holyrood. It was explained that Hate Crime applies to minorities and as women are not a minority group this Bill did not apply, hence more support for a Misogyny Bill. On You Tube

Lady Helena Kennedy explained that hitherto it had been very difficult to prove Misogyny as a criminal offence but she reckoned that there are 6 – 10 areas, where it could be. If successful, Scotland could be the first country in the world, where misogyny would be a crime. SIGBI is supporting the Bill.

Gari circulated details about a round table discussion that UN House Scotland is holding on Human Rights and Child Poverty, on 13 June. She is hoping for a representative from the Scottish Government to describe what action it is taking on child poverty. She reminded members that it is a human right not to live in poverty.

She also said that on 15 June there would be a Model UN for Highland schools via Zoom.

3S

Marjory reported that Thea had been given a cheque to go to Ghana instead of China. She also reported that Kirsty, who was due to go to Chile in 2020, had had her trip cancelled so she had gone to university instead. Project Trust will keep her cheque from the 3S Trust, along with all her other funds raised, until she is 25. It cannot repay the 3S Trust this money: if she does not use it, it will be used to fund a delegate from an area where it is difficult to raise sufficient funds.

Visit to Castleview Primary School Orchard

Nikki and Lindsey managed a rather rainy visit to Castleview Primary School this month to meet up with some of the pupils of Primary 5 with their teacher, Kirsten.

The tree in the orchard was gifted by SI Edinburgh to mark the centenary of Soroptimist International and was planted

in March 2021 by Richard Darke and his team from the Edinburgh and Lothian Greenspace Trust but pandemics and primary schools do not do well together and it wasn't until the risk from Covid had diminished somewhat that the school was willing to agree on a visit. Kirsten had helped facilitate the planting so it was especially good to meet with her and her pupils who were delighted to point out to Nikki that the trees had certainly grown!

The planting area was chosen as there had been little use for the elevated piece of land at the rear of the school and is surrounded by strong netting – an entrance gate is to be added shortly and a beehive is proposed with the whole area being turned in a wild flower meadow! We hope that within the next year or so, pupils will see some pretty apple blossom in the spring with the promise of fruit in the autumn!

Our Update on the W7 from Pat Black!

"The G7 Summit meeting of Global Leaders, led by the Chancellor of Germany, is due to start next week, 26 June 2022.

I am fortunate to be one of the Advisors to the G7 through the Women (W) 7 group. We have worked hard over the last few months to produce strong recommendations to the world's most influential people on issues affecting Women.

In our own countries we have been advocating with our own Governments, and I was fortunate enough to be able to present our W7 demands to Scottish Minister for Equalities, Christina McKelvie at the recent SI Scotland South meeting."
