On February 21st, several club members attended the Round table event, organised by UNHouse Edinburgh interns, "Mainstreaming the Eradication of Child Poverty – a human rights perspective" held at the Scottish Parliament. This is the third in a series of events, they have organised, with a focus on poverty as a human rights issue. It was a well-attended and informative event. The panel speakers provided a range of perspectives about the issues including referring to recent data that indicates that there are now 1 in 3 children in the UK, living in poverty and that there has been a marked increase in the number of children under the age of 18 who are involved in "forced criminality".

Matters arising from 8th November

- Leaflet to explain sextortion: Liz has found a leaflet produced by Ineque (an organization to help navigate/explain on-line abuse for parents and children) ACTION : Dorothy and Judith to review document and consider whether suitable to place on our FB/Website pages. Liz will check re any potential Copyright issues.
- Streamlining SIE email communication: more to do and so will defer to next meeting
- 16 Days/Eradicating Violence Against Women: Posters re On-line abuse have been distributed by members and Liz has made contact with Edinburgh College (awaiting a reply)
- Friendship Link approach from Kirkintilloch: Liz has spoken to the Club and they will come back to us.
- Domestic Homicide: Judith was looking into and will provide update for SIEnna.
 Minutes of last meeting proposed and seconded.

Key items:

SIGBI Conference in Edinburgh 1-3 Nov 2024.

Liz met with SIGBI President Ruth to discuss any support from SI Edinburgh/Scotland South Region.

There is no requirement for a 'Welcome to Edinburgh' speech or any stewarding. There might be a requirement for some help with guiding people to seats to ensure maximum useage.

Conference theme will be Soroptimist purpose – Standing up for women and girls – education, empowerment, enabling.

Liz ran through several requests received from Ruth and Club made decision on each.

1) Can we approach a few local cafes and suggest they offer a discount to delegates?

Yes, Liz and Nikki

- Can we suggest dinner options for clubs? Yes (provide a list and advise to pre-book)
- Any ideas for local or country wide tours? Suggest the Committee speak to Tourist Information Edinburgh or Scottish Tourist Board
- 4) Can we offer home hospitality? No
 not as part of the conference publicity.
- 5) Any ideas about suitable Scottish music to accompany the parade of flags? Suggest a female piper. She will be best placed to recommend a suitable tune
- 6) Any thoughts on a suitable venue for Conference dinner on the Saturday night? Suggestions included Heart of Midlothian Football Ground, Dynamic Earth, Murravfield Rugby around. Edinburgh Castle. ACTION: Gari has contact in Visit Scotland who mav be interested in helping identify a venue. Gari to contact. Recommend a Ceilidh and Dinner
- 7) Could we recommend a Man with a Van to drive to Stockport and back? No – plenty advertised. (note Emission Zone charge from June)
- Have we a contact for Smalls for All they could approach re a collection? Yes – Lindsey can provide contact address for Smalls for All
- Meet and greet at airport or station? No – not practical unless offering onward transport to city centre/hotels etc. Could possibly provide details of options to get from Airport/Train station

Conference website will be open 1/4/24. Current Rector of Edinburgh University, Debora Kayembe to open Conference. (Liz has written to her inviting her to meet a few Edinburgh Soroptimists in advance) We suggested that an Orange Café is organised for the Friday morning as Edinburgh is where it started! They will consider idea.

Scotland South Region -PAMM update on new operating model.

Check-in meeting held in January with all new team leads. All teams established with sufficient volunteers from Clubs. Positive response to new way of working and sharing of responsibilities. PAMM team continue to oversee set-up and help resolve any issues that hadn't been anticipated. 2 Short-life teams set up 1) to consider future of 3S fund and 2) to establish Regional meeting rhythm. Both will disband when task completed.

Update from 3S team: Trustees and a number of Club members with experience of the Fund. Summary of email/report :The 3S Fund was started in 1990 with the aim of 'Supporting projects which improve the lives of women and girls to achieve their potential in line with the objects of Soroptimist international'. This aim has been achieved over the years with over £65.000 having been disbursed to successful candidates. The fund account presently holds just under £4,865. Team identified issues re the continuation of the Fund - impact of COVID and associated restrictions, organisations that supported applicants have closed, less Clubs to contribute money to the Fund, and escalating costs of support requested it concluded that the fund is insufficient to make a real and effective impact.

The current balance will be donated to the Soroptimist International Foundation (as it has similar objectives) ACTION Nikki to get clarity on the objectives of the SI Foundation and whether similar 3S applicants would be eligible.

Art College Prize : Colette from the Art College met with Alison and Liz to discuss the possibility of us committing to an annual award over next 5 years. She was delighted at the suggestion. Proposed £300 per year for 5 years. The prize will be awarded to one student each year, for creative and innovative work linked to sustainability projects/products. So that it also ties in with SI goals the aim will be to enable education and empower women in their final year of undergraduate studies. Suggest we start from this academic year. The award will be identified as donated by SI Edinburgh and we have been asked to be involved in the selection of the winner and to attend the prize giving and degree show. Need to think of a name - current thinking 'Soroptimist Sustainability Awardfunded by SI Edinburgh'

Unanimous agreement to proceed with this initiative. ACTION: Colette is drafting a brief for our consideration.

International Womens' Day :

Significant resources provided by IWD. Slogan 'Inspire Inclusion'. Suggested activity for SIE – 1)do a 5 day count down to 8/3/24 on our FB page - celebrating womens achievement.2) launch our Art College Award 3) attend the Scottish Womens Convention event at Holyrood on 2/3/24 (booking now closed but email and register to be on the waiting list) 4)look at using the IWD email signature sign-off 'block' from now until the end of March ACTION : Nikki to share the 'block' to be individuals.5)consider downloaded by attending SI Dunfermline's meeting at the Carnegie Centre 7pm 7/3/24. ACTION : Liz to contact Eva and get details - post meeting note - it is the 14th March.

Orange the World : Liz suggested a small sub group to make recommendations as to how we continue this initiative – reference Equally Safe Scotland – plan our approach for next period. ACTION : Anna, Elaine, Liz and Judith volunteered to form planning team.

Big Plastic Count campaign : opportunity to count how much plastic is recycled during week 11 – 17th March. To be done on individual basis but we can promote our participation on FB. ACTION : register by emailing help@the bigplasticcount.com (document circulated with meeting invite)

Campaign to overhaul Police Scotland

– initiative by Scottish Womens Equality and the Scottish Womens Convention, to address racism and misogyny in Police Scotland. (documents circulated with meeting invite) Agreement that as a Club we would partner with SWE and SWC plus ask all members to consider signing to the petition on an individual basis. <u>https://www.womensequality.org.uk/police</u> <u>scotland_open_letter</u>

The Welcoming (support in Edinburgh for refugees) conversation group

Dorothy and Elaine attended recent conversation café at The Welcoming. High %age of males in attendance but they understand there is a female only café on a Tuesday. The Welcoming said if we wished to set up our own café then they would publicise it for us.

We would need to consider which area? What else is available in the area? How many people? Actual venue? ACTION : Elaine is to visit the Out of the Blue Drill Hall on Leith Walk and see what they are offering. She will also attend a Tuesday café at the Welcoming to do some more research.

Membership - Anna

Anna has been in touch with all 4 potential members and will continue to invite them to relevant events and share meeting details with them. Nikki is following up on another possible member.

Treasurer - Dorothy

In view of update re 3S fund Dorothy will arrange for the existing donations of £27.60 for 3S to be added to the donations received from members for the Soroptimist International Foundation International Women's Day event Dunfermline 14.3.2024 at 7pm





UN House Scotland sends a special note of thanks to SI Edinburgh and Soroptimists from other Clubs in Scotland for their support and attendance at the Roundtable on Human Rights and Child Poverty in Scotland.

The event at the Scottish Parliament on Wednesday 21 February drew attention to the lived experience of being in poverty, policies for the eradication of child poverty and research into the criminalization of children who experience lives of poverty.

A letter from SI Caldwell to our Club:

Dear Irene, I know we have been corresponding for quite a few years and I have enjoyed sharing your letters with my club.

SI Caldwell was chartered in 1946 by SI Boise. Caldwell is in Southwest Idaho with a population of about 60,000+ and growing.

We are now in the new Region of Plains to Plains of SIA. We hold 2 meetings a month, a business and program meeting and a board meeting on the 1st Thursday of the month. Meetings are generally held at noon, with lunch. We have 30 members; we gained some new members but also lost a few. We sometimes have speakers from other organizations.

We generally have several fundraisers a year. We raised about \$15,000 from our annual spaghetti dinner in October and a live auction and silent auction of donations.

We also helped out at a county Health Fair for elderly and disabled people in April, where different vendors give out information and samples; we helped set up and did the registration.

In August we sell programs for the Caldwell Night Rodeo and raise about \$1500; the Rodeo is held outside and is a big event for the Caldwell area.

At Christmas time we sponsor a family at a local women's shelter, buying gifts for the mother and children. We have a fun party with food and games and also do a gift exchange amongst members.

We like to have fun. This year we had a Bunco party (I think this is a dice game), a dance class, and also put together art kits for the shelter.

Depending on how much we fundraise, we give out Live Your Dream Awards; last

year we gave out 2 Awards for a total of \$7,000. We also give to numerous local organizations including 3 women's shelters, an Anti-Trafficking organization in Idaho, YMCA, and Salvation Army. It always makes us feel good to be able to support these projects.

During Covid we held virtual Zoom meetings and were really glad when we could start meeting again in person.

We have done a Dream It Be It program with local high school/middle school girls for the last 2 years; it has been a challenge but we will try again this spring. Being of an older generation this project has been a real learning session for us about young girls and how they think and what they do.

Our officers hold their office for 1 year; sometimes the Treasurer will do more than 1 year.

I will turn 76 in a few days and am among the retired ladies of our club. I have been a member of this club for almost 9 years and previously was a member of another club in Idaho before moving to Caldwell after my retirement. I worked in the potato industry (famous Idaho Potatoes) for over 35 years. I love what Soroptimists do to help women and how we try to help not only our local women but around the world.

Well Irene, I hope this letter finds you well. Keep writing. How long have you been our Friendship Sister? And I wish your club success in the future in these troublesome times. Take care and love from me and all from SI Caldwell.

Also, I got two invitations for guest lectures in the spring - one in Germany and one in Budapest. So, I am quite happy. And finally something that I was really happy about – on November 22, I was given the Faculty's award for life's work (the highest award given to one person every third year). It's a very rewarding feeling to get a recognition like that at the end of the career"

Our congratulations on that wonderful award were sent for the New Year, and finally Nada says as from the 1st of January she will be President of SI Maribor for the next two year – well if you need someone for a job, trying asking a retired person, they'll have nothing else to do – will they!!
