President's Report 2023 - 2024

It's been a busy year! What with our consideration of and responses to the proposed SIGBI modernisation agenda, getting used to different ways of working across the region through PAMM whilst all the time continuing to cement and build on our work to empower, enable and educate women and girls both as a club and in partnership with others - we have covered a lot of ground!

The focus of the work of clubs is their programme action so the focus of my remarks this year are to celebrate and reflect on some of the things we have achieved through our advocacy and action and what we propose to do – always with the UN sustainable goals in mind.

Advocacy

- Participation in the 'Eradication of Child Poverty' webinar and seminar in Parliament where we were proactive in asking questions and mentioned in the first report writeup.
- Sharing information from Suzy Lamplugh Trust - some members attended the training session on 'Stand up against harassment' to give us confidence in

- intervening appropriately if someone appears to be being harassed.
- Through the Linda Norgrove Foundation, supported women students in Afghanistan through lobbying Parliament re changing the criteria for migration to allow women to come to Scotland to finish their medical studies and qualify. Plus made a donation to help fund their work in Afghanistan.
- Supported the Scottish Women's Convention (SWC) campaign to eradicate misogynistic and discriminatory behaviours in Police Scotland.
- Appointed partner of the month in June by UNHouse Edinburgh.

Ongoing activities

Christmas Gifts to the Women's Hostel, Leith

In November members packed toiletries into 18 small white carrier bags topped with orange paper, with a selection of shampoos, body wash, soap etc and a donation from 'Joe Cool' of warm socks. To this we added a grand total of 30 Christmas wrapped seasonal presents from members of the club – warm hats, gloves, scarves etc and other donations for the clients at the Hostel – all were safely delivered in good time for Christmas.

Marie Curie Daffodil Appeal

While we no longer do this as a club group out on the weeks of the appeal, we had three members, Christine, Anna and Edith, contacted by Marie Curie Edinburgh Branch to ask if they would offer their services. This is now the preferred way both for us and for the charity as it allows individual members to collect on a day and at place that suits them. The three members were at different collecting points in the city and all reported back that this was a successful way to do a collection.

We continue to support the sorting and packing of clothes for children at Ratho. These are beautifully laundered and distributed by social care and other charities to families with children who otherwise may not be able to attend school or take part in everyday activities because of lack of warm, suitable or waterproof outfits.

Orange the world

The Orange cafes are still held regularly at a a variety of locations around the City to raise awareness of the campaign and provide information about organisations that can support women who are affected by abuse. The international interest continues with there now being several cafes run across Australia.

We drafted our Phoenix Pledge to support that organisation in their publicity of the campaign and were able to complete most of the actions listed on it.

New projects

Big Plastic Count in March 2024

Several members took part in the challenge which was to collect and record plastic use over one week. We await more members returning their numbers but at present we have Liz with 20 items and Lindsey 19 items over the week. We also await the collated results that were returned to the organisers of the event.

Sustainability Art Prize

Established an annual art prize to be awarded to the final year student whose work shows most innovative and sustainable use of materials. The first award will be presented at the final year graduate show in May.

Supporting refugee and asylum seeking women arriving into Edinburgh with their English language learning

We continue to explore how best to get involved in this area. Members have met with groups at The Welcoming several times to seek their views and arrangements are in place to link up with the City Council community officer and LinkNET mentoring. This will enable us to be clear about where there may be gaps in support and for the club to decide how and whether we can help e.g. through our own conversation cafes or mentoring..

Orange the World

Proposals for action during 2024 include "oranging" a parade of shops in Edinburgh during the 16 days of activism, engaging with the VAWG coordinator in the City Council to consider how we might work together, following up on the proposals for a Misogyny Act and exploring how we might raise more awareness about the issues of domestic homicide e.g. commemorative benches

A massive thankyou to everyone for your commitment, energy and enthusiasm for our work and ensuring that we move forwards on projects where we are confident we can make a difference however small.

Next year is the 30th anniversary celebration of the Beijing declaration 1995 that aimed to mainstream women's rights as human rights. It is signed up to by 189 states. Next year, the Convention on the Status of Women (CSW) will be chaired by Saudi Arabia – not known for its positive record on women's rights! Other governments too are rolling back on commitments to the human rights of women and girls. In 2024 – 2025 let's keep a close eye on the local and global context and take every opportunity, with our partners and link to the UN to highlight concerns and advocate for better life outcomes for women and girls.

Liz suggested we do not touch the Legacy fund at the moment as a sum of money from that is allocated to the Art prize. Suggested a small sum to a charity concerned with domestic homicide given its high profile at the moment.

Discussion about possible donation to Womens' Aid as pertinent to domestic violence.

Judith suggested there are other charities in this field where a small donation may have a bigger impact

ACTION - Judith to contact City of Edinburgh Council violence against women co ordinator for suggestions of relevant charities

There was a suggestion that we quantify what a donation would achieve eg £x.00 will pay for 1 hour of counselling - this will help when submitting Programme Action information.

No other funds to be allocated at present in order to support other needs over the year.
