# 1. Programme Action

16 Days of Activism - Orange the World: Liz thanked everyone involved for their amazing activity to promote the 16 days across retailers in Bruntsfield and Morningside, libraries across the City and promotion across Social Media. Pat did a fantastic job posting interesting and powerful information every day during the definitely more campaign. There is conversations, and greater visibility of ending Violence Against Women, taking place at all levels. We must carry on raising this awareness and pushing for action! Potential focus for club for this year.

ACTION: 1) to make the work done on populating social media worthwhile, all members are asked to check posts eg on Facebook, and then 'like', 'comment' and/or 'share'. This will help promote all our campaigns and will raise awareness of the organisation. 2) Liz to send out email asking for volunteers to form a small sub group to define what action WE can take to keep this on important agendas. 3)Nikki to follow up on current status of the proposed Misogyny Bill in the Scottish

## **Easyfundraising**
