SIGBI Programme Director Sue Biggs and the Assistant Programme Directors have put together varied and interesting sessions for Saturday 2 November as follows: -



MARY'S MEALS – Daniel Adams

This is the original shed that was used to stockpile food and clothing for Bosnian refugees in the 1990s. It still serves today as Mary's Meals HQ. The idea of providing school-age children with one good meal a day sprang from the simple wish of a 14 year old boy in Malawi whose mother was dying of AIDS. His hope 'to have enough to eat and to go to school one day' struck a chord with Magnus Macfarlane Barrow; if the promise of a meal could lure a child to school then education could offer an escape from dependence.

Mary's Meals now provides for a daily school meal for over 650,000 children in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean and Eastern Europe. Hear how it happens from Daniel Adams.

KARMA NIRVANA - Jasvinder Sanghera

Jasvinder is an activist and advocate for women's rights. She is the cofounder of Karma Nirvana, a community based project where several refuge centres across the UK serve as safe-housing for South Asian women fleeing forced marriages.

When faced with the prospect of forced marriage herself she ran away from home.

She told her story in her first novel *Shame* and that of other victims in her second book *Daughters of Shame*. Now happily married with three daughters of her own she ensures that they have enough freedom to date and to find their own husbands.
