#### The Artists' Club

The last 'Gentlemen Only' club in Liverpool opened its doors to give an hospitable welcome to Soroptimists from SI Crosby, Liverpool and Southport on 10<sup>th</sup> May. The club, in Eberle Street, Liverpool has over 400 members, men only! It was founded in 1877 and has occupied premises in the centre of Liverpool since 1889.

It remains true to its original purpose which is to provide an environment where the artist community can associate with the business and professional community of the City in convivial circumstances. The Club is renowned for its friendliness and warm informality.







A unique feature of the Club is its collection of portraits of its Presidents. Every President since 1889 has had his portrait painted in oils by an artist member. The full collection is hung in the Club. The Club mounts about six art exhibitions every year. These feature the work of Artist members or artists working in the northwest. Helen of SI Crosby, whose husband is the current President, kindly arranged the invitation for Soroptimists to enjoy the occasion. We were welcomed with a Liverpool Gin, a work of art! The three-course meal was concluded with the club's signature dessert, an Eccles cake served with cheese!







### Regional Conference at the Ramada Hotel, Southport- 12th May 18

Regional President Margaret Davies invited all regional members to a very successful conference in Southport. Her theme was "Reach Out!". Attended by over a hundred and thirty members from clubs across South Lancashire, North West England and the Isle of Man, delegates were uplifted by talks which ranged on a variety of topics. Hannah Flint (Stop the Traffik) encouraged Soroptimists to continue educating the public about modern day slavery. Patricia Gatherum, Federation Ambassador for the Meru Garden Project, spoke entertainingly about her recent visit to the project in Kenya and the difference it is making to the lives of women there. Ben Mott gave a fascinating insight into caring for people with dementia. Concluding the afternoon's programme, Sue Williams (Federation President Elect) spoke about her visit to Nepal, and the work being carried out by the members of SI Kathmandu. In addition, she flagged up her ongoing interest in mental health support, and the importance of looking after ourselves as well as others. The afternoon finished with an impromptu rendition by our club members of the Four Tops singing "Reach out, I'll be there!". Eat your heart out Motown!!
