Emily Spurrell, the Merseyside Police Crime Commissioner updated everyone on the progress made by Merseyside Police to support women and girls. Shana Begum from SI St Helens also spoke in support too. Plenty of stalls offering support, including SI St Helens. The event ended with a candle-lit silence to remember victims.



## Education, Economic and Environment PAC Group

Soroptibooks continue to be accepted and appreciated by those families who attend the weekly sessions at Lodge Lane Food Pantry. We passed 2 years of this initiative in November 2023, and consequently we have watched some of the children who had their first books as babies, grow into toddlers and schoolchildren, still enjoying their weekly books. Parents take home books for their older children. We have become familiar with their individual preferences, and are able to look out for them when available.

Our supply of books from SIL Club members has been well supplemented by Liverpool FC Academy staff each week since September. The Under 23 LFC players attend the Pantry as part of their Education in the Community. They have been a good help with carrying heavy boxes of books, and putting up much-needed gazebos in bad weather!

LFC Academy staff also purchased toys, books and toiletries to support our SIL Club initiative to provide a better Christmas for clients of a refuge in Knowsley. We joined other club members in delivering these items, and accepting an invitation to a wonderful Carol concert.

For the 3<sup>rd</sup> Christmas running, our thanks go to the same 3 young friends who have bought a lovely selection of brand new, hardback books. This time focussing on for the younger age, babies and toddlers.

Yet again we supported a charity supporting young people who have experiences family bereavement.

## **Health PAC Group**


A club member raised awareness of Women's Heart risks and brokered a meeting with a specialist hospital, Liverpool Heart and Chest Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (LHCH) to discuss delivery of an event on Women's Heart Health. We had several meetings with the prevention team at the Trust to arrange delivery of the event.

We chose this programme to raise awareness of heart risks in women. Cardio Vascular disease kills nearly 900,000 women in the UK living with CHD. Women are less aware of risk, less likely to recognise symptoms of a heart attack, slower to call 999.

35 women attended the event on 14th October. Session delivered by Soroptomists, LHCH Prevention Team and 2 Trust Governors Excellent feedback from our partners LHCH who delivered individual health checks for attendees . It was an opportunity for members of other club attending to discuss the possibility of repeating the delivery across the Region. LHCH Charity also raised £140 at the event. Attendees were issued with a useful leaflet on Women and Heart Disease - reducing your risk. Without exception, all attendees gave very positive feedback requesting more events of a similar nature. We are currently researching delivery across Merseyside/ Region and how we can encourage women from areas of deprivation to attend events.

A Soroptimist from a Regional club said " We need to take this to Region and deliver across Merseyside, an excellent informative event"

As SIGBI Safeguarding Lead, Annette was invited to speak about her role in Harrogate to the SIYAMS group, This is a group of women from a number of clubs in the Yorkshire region who meet bi-monthly to think of action that they can complete to fight modern slavery. Their most recent project was working with schools to get children to design bookmarks about online safety, and healthy relationships.
