Violence and Conflict Group

SI Liverpool has received a refund from The Royal Liverpool Charity fund to the value of £1419.70. It was agreed by the club that the monies would be given to organisations that support women and girls who have been subject to violence in all forms, and where the money could underpin an educational aspect of care. The South Liverpool Domestic Abuse Services (SLDAS) and Amadudu Refuge have been identified as recipients of funds.

President elect Rosemary, Anne Grimes and Sue Woods held a zoom meeting with Diane Jean, a member of Zonta International, in April. Zonta International have worked in recent years with Savera UK to organise a march and other events in Liverpool to mark 16 days of activism 25th November to 10th December. Si Liverpool are looking to collaborate with both groups in the planning for events in November and looking to include other local Soroptimist groups. Information has been received which will be disseminated to club and region in the next few weeks.

Dorothy has sent in a photo of a Tie Blanket (no sew tie blanket) and would like to know if any club members have made one of these. All you need is:

Health and Food Security Group

The group continue to coordinate collection of items for the food bank on behalf of the club. Our latest project, because of a successful partnership with LHCH to deliver an event on Women's Heart Health, is to explore the possibility to deliver a Women's Health Event. To this end we have approached SWAGGA, a group of GP practices and NHS Trusts who are working to address health inequalities in South Liverpool. We hope to have an initial meeting to explore how we might support events. We are also pleased to be able to support SI Crosby to develop and deliver a Women's Heart Event in the Sefton area, replicating our event with LHCH. We have brokered a meeting with LHCh and SI Crosby, shared our planning, lessons learnt and will support SI Crosby any way we can to ensure success. A great example of working together.

Education, Economic and Environment PAC Group

It has been agreed that we will continue to work with the First Step Project at Huyton and so we are looking into how we will be able to assist them in the future in a practical way.

Members recently took part in the Big Plastic Count, which took place from 11-17 March. Overall 1 in every 300 people from the UK took part, 8 members of SI Liverpool included.

This was not a Soroptimist project but a countrywide project where household units have been requested to count the numbers of individual pieces of plastic accounting to types. They were then recorded online throughout a week in April.

The statistics were recorded and the organisers have reported back to the households and also given us total figures for the country. This project has raised awareness among Soroptimists members who became involved in last years count and they have stated that they now use less plastic, which is the ultimate aim!

I was also pleased to attend Strawberry Fields in August and present a cheque to support the Steps to Work programme which was one of our charities last year, also to Knifesavers when Lauren attended our November Club meeting as our Speaker. Can I also take this opportunity to thank Mary Smith for her hard work as our Speaker secretary, contacting potential speakers, making arrangements to attend our Club meetings, having a meal with them and making sure they taken care of during their visit...thank you Mary.

Whilst we have not welcomed any new members this year, apart from the honorary induction of Mary Rasmussen, Lord Mayor of Liverpool at our International lunch in December, we have had many visitors to our Club meetings over the year and hope they will join us in the near future. I thank Rosemary for her continued work as Membership Officer.

Our Club has fully engaged with the creation of Orange cafes, recognising 25th of the month, or as near as, as a day to meet locally to raise awareness of issues involving women and girls. We have held 3 of these so far, In Dobbies Garden centre, The Bridge Community centre in conjunction with South Liverpool Domestic Abuse Services and of course at the Womens Organisation in their Artisane café. We will continue with these events next year and I would like to thank all members who have attended and supported as well as Dorcas for her work as our Publicity Officer.

My Exec team this year have been so supportive and helpful and whilst we commenced the year with Josie as our PAC officer, she was unable to continue with this role within the Club due to her own personal loss, however I thank each and every one of the team, Dorcas, Debra, Pat, Rosemary, Val and Judith for their contributions and guidance.

I have attended many Charter lunches and Regional Club events this year and whilst have had a lovely time at each and every one of them, I really look forward to our own lunch and Change of Insignia next Sunday at the Pullman where we can celebrate our Club's 97th Birthday and I can pass the President's chain over to Rosemary who I look forward to supporting throughout her year.
