

Primary Objectives

- To review and evaluate the current approach to managing serious violence and criminal exploitation in Bedfordshire (CCE, missing, violence and gangs)
- To build upon the current approach to disrupting perpetrators of serious violence and criminal exploitation
- To develop a sustainable Bedfordshire Violence and Exploitation Reduction Partnership, building on the existing CCE, MAGPan (Multi-Gang Panel) and SV Panel Partnerships
- To develop and deliver a multi-agency and community prevention and early intervention offer for children and young people who are at risk of serious violence criminal exploitation in Bedfordshire
- To develop and deliver a multi-agency and community response for children and young people between involved in serious violence and criminal exploitation in Bedfordshire
- To develop a consistent approach to data-sharing between partners



Bedfordshire – problem profile



Comprises of **three unitary local councils**, and has a total population of 669,338. Central Bedfordshire has the highest population of the three councils. Bedfordshire has **more young people under 14 and in their 30s** than compared to England and also the East Region. It is **affluent overall**, but 13% of small areas are in the most deprived quintile in England, and are mainly located in Luton.

Uses **the WHO and the HO Strategy definitions**, and broadens this with an additional list of scope for other crime types (including exploitation and sexual assault).

Data used includes Police Recorded Crime data, NHS admissions data, and CSEW and survey data. They also mention the use of police.uk data – this links to PRC

Prevailing serious violence crime

- Almost half of all violence-related hospital admissions are in Luton (1055 for the whole of Bedfordshire: 505 from Luton, 290 from Bedford, and 260 from Central Bedfordshire)
- Crime proportions: 22% violence and sexual offences, 26% ASB, 10% vehicle crime, 8% criminal damage and arson, 8% burglary, 8% other theft; percentage of homicide, possession of weapons etc. not presented due to small numbers

Hotspots and hot times

- Hot spots are determined by certain crime types at different levels. Generally wards are provided for overall serious violence, but for drugs there is also the use of specific roads.
- NHS admissions shows seasonal variation, with July as a
 particularly high month. Days of the week with highest admissions
 are Sundays as highest (mostly from late Saturday night into
 Sunday morning), and then Saturdays. A&E data shows peak
 arrival time as 4am
- Serious violence data using Bedfordshire schools study found peak time 3-5pm during the school term

Priority crime types

The profile specifies violence with injury, violence without injury, knife crime, possession of weapons offences, exploitation, sexual assault, organised crime, drug related violence and county lines

Local community perceptions of SV

Drug dealing the most common area of concern, followed by residential burglary. Knife crime and violence was the fourth highest concern, but this was stronger in younger age groups. Gangs were also a concern, again more so with younger people. Area specific work showed that Serious Violence was the highest concern in Luton

Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE)

- XPLOITATION
 REDUCTION UNIT
- Child criminal exploitation (CCE) is a worryingly widespread form of child abuse that encompasses county lines gangs, child trafficking and modern slavery. The scope of child criminal exploitation is vast but, put simply, criminal exploitation is where children and young people are manipulated and coerced into committing crimes.
- The Children's Commissioner estimates that there are **at least 46,000 children** in England who are involved in gang activity, with 4,000 teenagers in London alone being victims of child criminal exploitation. The number could be even higher than this, as CCE is often a hidden form of abuse. If you have a responsibility for safeguarding children, it's essential that you know about child criminal exploitation and are able to recognise and take action when it may be occurring.

- The Youth Intervention Specialist (YIS) team is an innovative partnership initiative between the VERU, specialist providers of emotional counselling and practical support, and Bedfordshire Police. It has been designed to help and support the community, children and young people involved in and/or at risk of child criminal exploitation (CCE).
- The YIS team specialises in youth interventions. The team comes with a wealth of both lived and professional experiences, ready to support and work with victims, witnesses and those involved in criminal activities to include our specialist area around gang associations and gang mediation

- ► SAFEGUARDING & EDUCATION PRACTITIONER Experienced safeguarding practitioner, supporting and safeguarding young people and their families
- ► TRAUMA COUNSELLOR Personal knowledge and experience of exploitation as well as fleeing a war-torn country. Dedicated to supporting child victims of crime.
- ▶ **EX-GANG MEMBER/CONSULTANT** –Consultant to the Mayor of London on Gangs and Serious Youth Violence. Trainer and workshop facilitator. Experienced youth intervention specialists, dedicated to educating young people, communities about gang life, young peoples perception, reality and risks.
- ▶ YOUNG PEOPLE & FAMILY SUPPORT/MOTHER Dedicated to supporting families and individuals experiencing adversity following the loss of her son to knife crime.

Youth Intervention Specialist (YIS) Team



- ▶ Aim is to encourage the reduction of Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) and violent activities impacting our Bedfordshire community.
- Provide a supportive service for Educators, children, young people and their families - some of whom may be currently disengaged with services.
- Work with some young people and families who may not wish to engage with services
- ► Ensure that the community knows that there is a supplementary support service available for them, and anyone they are concerned about


