Model for community development and engagement

Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) is about people living in local places and taking responsibility for each other and their local resources.

It is a description, not a model, of how local residents grow collective efficacy (Sampson et al., 1999) and what they use to do so (McKnight, 2009).

What are the assets?

- > The gifts, skills, knowledge, and passions of all local residents
- > The power of local social networks/associations
- > The resources of public, private and non-profit institutions
- > The physical resources of place
- > The economic resources of place
- > The stories of its' residents shared lives



ABCD Principles and Practices

Principles	Practices
Citizen led	Best placed to do things together
Relationship oriented	Individuals from all sectors working towards consensual groupings
Asset based	What is currently strong and not what is wrong?
Place based	Explore what is available in the neighbourhood
Inclusion focused	How can you know what the community needs until you know what it has?
