



Ann Dawson Conference Chair As a long standing friend of SI Malta, and hence a regular visitor to Malta where I have always enjoyed the generous hospitality of Maltese Soroptimists, I am absolutely delighted that the 2016 SIGBI Conference is being held there. SI Malta was chartered in 1993 and is the only Soroptimist Club on the island, which has a population of just over 400,000.



The conference theme is **Engineering the Future**, a theme I chose in part to reflect my own career as a civil engineer (and which is also intended to embrace the broader theme of women in STEM [Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics]) but, as Conference Chair Ann says, it is also about the difference we as Soroptimists can 'engineer' through our work in educating, enabling and empowering the lives of women and girls.

We have three inspiring keynote speakers, who are:

Dr Dame Sue Ion DBE FREng who is a British engineer and an expert advisor on the nuclear power industry. Sue has been Vice President of the Royal Academy of Engineering since 2002 and was appointed as a Visiting Professor at Imperial College, London in 2006. Last year she was the first woman to receive one of the Royal Academy of Engineering's most prestigious accolades – the President's Medal – for her outstanding service to the nuclear industry, the Academy itself and to the wider world of engineering. Sue was a very well received speaker at last year's UK PAC Study Day. **Dr Helen Sharman OBE,** a British chemist who was working for Mars (researching chocolate flavours!) when she responded to a radio advertisement that captured her attention 'Astronaut wanted, no experience necessary', asking for applicants to be the first British astronaut. She was subsequently selected to travel into space ahead of nearly 13,000 other applicants. Helen was also the first woman to visit the Mir space station in 1991.

Dave Coplin, the Chief Envisioning Officer for Microsoft UK, who helps organisations and individuals envision the full potential that technology offers a modern, digital society. Dave is passionate about turning the technology into valuable assets that effect the way that we live, learn, work and play and in so doing, move the focus from the technology itself to the actual outcome. Committee member Helen Murdoch heard him recently and said that he was 'amazing, vibrant,' and several other accolades!!
