The Victims' Commissioner for England and Wales

The role of the Victims' Commissioner, as defined in s49 Domestic Violence, Crime and Victims Act 2004 is to:

- Promote the role of victims and witnesses
- Encourage good practice in the treatment of victims and witnesses
- And to keep under review the operation of the Victims' Code



The Domestic Abuse Act 2021

- A legal definition of domestic abuse for the first time
- Coercive and controlling behaviour offence now covers post-separation behaviour
- Explicit recognition of children as victims
- New offence of non-fatal strangulation
- Statutory presumption that DA victims are eligible for special measures in criminal, civil and family court
- Role of the **Domestic Abuse Commissioner** now set out in law
- Statutory duty placed on the Secretary of State to publish a domestic abuse perpetrator strategy



Family Law Harms Panel

- Family court cases involving DA in need of change
- Risk from the presumption of shared parenting
- Findings of fact on DA: not effective
- No press or public view on quality of justice

Family Law Harms Panel Recommendations



- From Spring 2022 no cross examination by perpetrator in person
- Special Measures better to facilitate best evidence
- Understanding from DA Act that children are victims of DA and not bystanders
- Further research of the presumption of shared parenting
- Monitoring and evaluation by ODAC and OVC as one of two aids to transparency



This looks at last like a strategic framework for tackling abuse in crime and in the family courts.....

BUT, as ever, there are reservations:

- Migrant women with no recourse to public funds a big outstanding issue that the Act is silent on
- There is poor read across from criminal courts to family courts both dealing with the same/similar issues
- It has all to be implemented quickly needs to be wellfunded



The Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill

Two key areas of interest in relation to VAWG:

Duty for all local groups, including police, to work together to tackle serious violence to be extended to domestic abuse and sexual violence

Digital download from rape complainants' devices and demands for personal material in the hands of third parties – legislative protection for victims is urgently needed and only half won so far



The End-to-End Rape Review

A review of how the CJS is failing by those responsible for its failure!

Producing compromise proposals and half of the

story....

The 'highs'....

Project Soteria – shifts the police's investigative focus on the offender rather than the victim

Rape 'scorecards' – published every 6 months under ministerial scrutiny with an external panel, including VC, DAC and VAWG sector agencies



The End-to-End Rape Review

The omissions....

- Extension of s28 (pre-recorded cross examination) to intimidated witnesses
- Independent legal representation
- Establishment of pilot Specialist Rape and Sexual Assault Courts
