
Regional Meeting

* During 16 days of activism – From 24 November to 10 December

We wore orange to highlight violence against women and girls. The Soroptimists "Believe to Achieve" by a collective global effort on the International Day to eliminate violence against girls and women. Jill Anderson our safeguarding officer had been relentlessly highlighting the issues on social media which enabled us to relate and pro-actively publicise the importance of some of the issues. My own club in SI Mansfield & District (Rita Hallsworth - joint P.A. officer) was being interviewed by the award winning reporter/managing director of the local radio station Mansfield 103.2 as she put her points across succinctly. We managed to plug Soroptimist International in the Nottinghamshire area.

Dates to Remember

6th March 2021 – Regional Meeting celebrating International Women's Day (IWD) will be conducted virtually on zoom – a possible joint event with the 3 regions for an IWD extravaganza. So watch the space.

26th June 2021 – Regional Meeting AGM may be face to face at The Link Hotel if it works out well with the vaccines by then. This will enable us to support the hospitality sector and be able to meet for the 1st time since the pandemic.

Our Proposal

*Empowering girls in Nepal Project – sadly the partnership between SIGBI and Chora Chori has been dissolved and so we propose to donate the fund raised to the Diamond Education Grant (DEG). Our Region will pay £1,200.00 to DEG which equates to £100 per club. I will make up the £10.00 for the balance of £490.00 to £500, so in essence this will be equally divided between the benevolent fund and another worthwhile project.

- 1. £250.00 to Benevolent fund
- 2. £250 to Rosie May Foundation. They were the runners up in the vote that Chori chori won at the Liverpool conference. Perhaps SIGBI could take them on as an alternative?

Diamond Education Grant | SIGBI

What is the Diamond Education Grant? This grant awarding body was set up by our Federation (SIGBI) in 1975.
