Soroptimists - Standing up for Women and Girls





A big thank you to our Soroptimist special friend Rowena, who presented us with 16 of her gorgeous handmade quilts. Mala and Jean had the lovely privilege to attend the YMCA MK Community Lunch this April and to present the quilts. These quilts will be handed out to residents in the first stage of supported living, and will stay with them as they progress and are supported at the YMCA to learn new skills and to get back into employment and into living their own independent lives. We wish them well. It was also a lovely way for Mala to start her linked officer work with link with them and see how we can help them.



And this month we were very kindly invited to a Thank you event held at the Winter Night Shelter.

The event was to thank volunteers for all their hard work in staffing the night shelters during the 2022/23 winter period. 403 incredible volunteers helped to serve 4,318 meals, make 1,218 beds and helped 65 guests of which 58 were moved into more secure accommodation.

And it was nice to be thanked for our continuing support. What ever form support comes in it is vital and does help.

Whilst April has been slightly quieter with regard to events, we had a great branch meeting and there is lots going on and coming up. Mala has had her first meeting with YMCA and is already looking at how we can find a business sponsor to help us donate sanitary towels and pants to the young women at the YMCA. And in the mean time we are all asked to help with baby clothes for YMCA residents who are pregnant and to see if any of our friends can help too.

Mary is hoping to be able to visit MK Act in the next few weeks to start talking to the families and to work with them to develop a part of the garden where they can grow their own food, to help in this cost of living crisis.

And we have had a meeting with Viktoryia from the Ukraine Appeal. They would like to help out with support for setting up a group to support pregnant Ukrainian women here in Milton Keynes.

On 3 June the Soroptimist International London and Chilterns Northern Region meeting is taking place in Redborne and it should be a good event. Hopefully we will have an update on the Domestic Violence Courts review and what the next stage will be.

And then another of our favourite fundraising events is on 19 August, our Fish and Chip Quiz night at Simpson Church. Please do put in your diary and encourage your friends to come along for a great night of fun and good food. Details of ticket prices etc will be out soon.

Plans are moving apace with our Violet Awards 2023, 8 September at MK Snap, to recognize volunteers at our linked charities who have gone above and beyond. And we will be asking for helpers in setting up and helping out on the night, so another date for your diary.

We are busy bees and in ending this editorial this month I again think about our membership. We may be a small group working hard to support our linked charities, but if we can encourage more members, just think how much more we can achieve. Milton Keynes is a growing city and we need to think about how we can reach more women to join us in our important work to help vulnerable women and girls to better lives and to achieve to their potential.

I wish everyone a lovely May, I am looking forward to our AGM on 23 May and our meal afterwards. A time to reflect on a year just gone of significant achievements and also an exciting year ahead for us. There is still so much to plan for with the Domestic Violence Courts project, our Music event, Violence Against Women 16 Days of Activism which I have not spoken about this time. Safe housing denied to 10,000 women in England fleeing domestic abuse. Lack of shelters may be forcing victims to return to their violence partners or leaving them homeless is one of the findings from the Women's Aid Annual Report.
