



Blake Lively: My domestic abuse film is tragic and inspiring



For many young women, there have been very few film adaptations as hotly anticipated as Colleen Hoover's It Ends With Us.

The 2016 book became an internet sensation a few years ago - it took TikTok's #booktok by storm with more than one billion tags and sold 20 million copies as the number one New York Times bestseller.

While on the surface the film appears to be a standard romantic comedy, it comes with a dark twist. Starring Gossip Girl star Blake Lively, it tells the story of Lily Bloom, a young woman who grew up witnessing domestic abuse and winds up in the same position years later. **Click here** to read the full BBC article. Police inbox for victims of violence not monitored



A woman who was held at knife point by her former partner has said it is disgraceful a police email inbox for reporting incidents of violence and abuse was not monitored for nine months.

Sadie Hopkins, 50, from Shrewsbury, Shropshire, sent a message to West Mercia Police's violence against women and girls inbox after a chance encounter with her attacker, but did not get a response.

Alice Milliat – the mother of the Olympics



Alice Milliat (May 1884 – May 1957) was a pioneer of women's sport. Her lobbying on behalf of female athletes led to the accelerated inclusion of more women's events in the Olympic Games.

And this year the Paris Olympics was the first since the Olympics commenced in 1896 to provide places equally to female and male athletes. In 1900 the Paris games were

the first to allow women to compete. The Guardian view on Femicide: why we count the women who die



At least 50 women in the UK have allegedly been killed by men so far this year. This violence must be acknowledged – and acted upon.

It is around half a century since the idea of femicide was introduced by feminists. It is "a term that specifically points to and politicises the sexist, patriarchal, misogynistic killing of women and girls by men", wrote one of the key developers, activist and scholar Diana Russell. The point was not merely to identify a problem: it was to challenge people to recognize and act upon it. **Click** here to read the Guardian article. Leah Croucher's family warn system needs to change



The family of a teenager abducted and killed by a wanted sex offender believe other families will suffer the same "soul crushing consequences" unless the probation system changes.

Leah Croucher, 19, disappeared while walking to work on 15 Feb 2019. Her remains were discovered in Oct 2022 in a house in Milton Keynes – less than half a mile from her home. The coroner at the inquest into her death called for a review of the monitoring of sex offenders in the community after failings were identified.

Technology Facilitated Domestic Abuse - TFDA



What is Technology Facilitated Domestic Abuse? TFDA is rapidly becoming the norm rather than the exception. It is where perpetrators misuse technology to track locations, monitor partner's online activity, damage their personal relationships/character, cause harm emotionally, physically, psychologically etc.

TFDA is intricately linked with coercive control. Technology allows domestic abuse perpetrators an enhanced level of access to information about their partner and children.

The SIGBI Safeguarding team have put together a very informative presentation. If you go to the Hub, click on Library, click on Governance, click on Safeguarding then click on Safeguarding Topics-presentations and look for Safeguarding – Technology Facilitated Domestic Abuse presentation. Afghan women to finish medical studies in Scotland



Nineteen female medical students banned from attending university in Afghanistan are to complete their studies in Scotland.

They were forced to give up medicine after the Taliban retook control of Afghanistan three years ago and clamped down on women's rights.

Cecilia Payne 1900 - 1979

A British-American astronomer and astrophysicist. In her 1925 thesis proposed that stars were composed primarily of hydrogen and helium. Her groundbreaking conclusion was initially rejected, because it contradicted the science of the time, which held that no significant elemental differences distinguished the Sun and Earth.
