# **Editorial Welcome**



We had a great meeting this February, as we welcomed Viktoryia Shatenko, Co founder of the Ukraine22 Appeal as our newest linked charity.

It was quite inspiring to hear about their work in sending out vital support back to the Ukraine but also the work they are doing here in Milton Keynes to hdelp and give advice to all the mums and children. Viktoryia updated us on the new after school, called Sunflower school now running on Saturdays at present and located at Summerfield School. It provides supplementary lessons on language, culture art and educational games. It is hoped to extend it but they do need materials and funding.

Viktoryia mentioned that they are desperately looking for a logistics firm to help them get goods back to the Ukraine, especially medical items. She has had hospitals contact her to say they need all types of medical equipment and medicines. As a result, Rosella has already been round a number of charity shops and now has a car load of crutches to give to Viktoryia and is speaking to a local Pastor who may know of a Logistics firm who might be able to help.

But if anyone knows of any de commissioned medical supplies please let Viktoryia know as we can see from the news, the war is getting worse.

And Viktoryia concluded her talk to us by saying her long term project is to have a Rehabilitation centre. I hope we can help the Ukraine Appeal charity in whatever way we can. I came away from our meeting inspired by her energy, her can do and positive attitude to find ways to help both the Ukraine community here and back home.

It was a great privilege to attend and show our support at the memorial service at Christ the Cornerstone Church on 25 February to mark one year of the Ukraine War. This situation will not end soon and we may be a small group but whatever help we can give whether it is funding, supplies and through friendship all will help. That's what we Soroptimists are good at.



Last month we reported that we couldn't believe how many SOS toiletries we had to sort through in January and it was lovely to see our charities faces when they saw how many smellie items we delivered to them.

We will be getting together every quarter to sort and distribute these to our charities so please do continue to encourage your friends to donate any unused toiletries to us. And if you know of

any where who will be willing to take on a box at their premises for people to drop toiletries into please let us know. We are grateful to our current sites at Red House GP surgery, Great Linford Parish Council offices, The Mead Centre and MK Snap.

The first female Speaker of the House of Commons Betty Boothroyd has died aged 93.

She served as Speaker from 1992 to 2000, before going on to become a baroness in the House of Lords from 2001.

# There are 52 indicators against the 17 UN SDG Global Goals



Across all the 17 Global Goals (SDG's) there are 52 indicators related to women and girls.

For example, under Goal 5, Gender Equality there are fourteen indicators such as the 'proportion of women in managerial positions and the 'proportion of individuals who own a mobile telephone, by sex.'

But gender equality is not confined to Goal 5.

These 52 indicators are reminders of the intersectional impact of gender equality. That's 52 reminders that gender equality means less poverty, more climate justice, better health, stronger economies, and so much more.

# Sandi Toksvig calls for CofE bishops to be removed from Lords over same-sex marriage



Humanists UK Patron Sandi Toksvig, an advocate for women leading their best lives, has called for Church of England bishops to be removed from the House of Lords, over its opposition to conducting same-sex marriages.

There are only two countries in the world where representatives of the state religion automatically get a seat in the legislature. They are the UK and Iran. A curious and indeed uncomfortable club of two to belong to. 26 bishops from the Church of England, selected by the Church, sit as a matter of right in the House of Lords.

Not bishops from Scotland, Wales, or Northern Ireland, not leaders of our many other beliefs: Muslims, Catholics, all other Christian faiths, Hindus, Jews, Sikhs, humanists, Buddhists, and so on.
