We talked about a charter on environmental awareness but we could take action by making green pledges as a club and as individuals. I have noticed there are a couple of other Soroptimist clubs who have gone down this route.

Why don't we come up with a list of green pledges we can all do as a club and as individuals. To kick start this off, here are my green pledge ideas:

- Never buy plastic bags use for life bags, make own out of recycled materials or using natural fiber lifetime bags
- 2. Walk to the local shops or local places to reduce the use of the car where possible
- 3. Eat a meat free meal at least once a week
- 4. Never buy plastic bottles of drinks, but use a recycled drinks container
- 5. Limit shoes and clothes purchase to only buy when necessary
- 6. Recycle everything possible, including clothes, books, DVD by giving to MK Charity shops and buying from them.

I hope we can discuss this at our February meeting and agree a set of Green Pledges. So please come along with your ideas.

6 Feb - International Day of Zero Tolerance to Female Genital Mutilation



Female genital mutilation (FGM) comprises all procedures that involve altering or injuring the female genitalia for non-medical reasons and is recognized internationally as a violation of the human rights, the health and the integrity of girls and women.

Girls who undergo female genital mutilation face short-term complications such as severe pain, shock, excessive bleeding, infections, and difficulty in passing urine, as well as long-term consequences for their sexual and reproductive health and mental health.

Although primarily concentrated in 30 countries in Africa and the Middle East, female genital mutilation is a universal problem and is also practiced in some countries in Asia and Latin America. Female genital mutilation continues to persist amongst immigrant populations living in Western Europe, North America, Australia and New Zealand

In 2012, the UN General Assembly designated February 6th as the International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation, with the aim to amplify and direct the efforts on the elimination of this practice. This year, the UNFPA-UNICEF Joint Programme on the Elimination of Female Genital Mutilation: Delivering the Global Promise launched the 2023 theme; "Partnership with Men and Boys to transform Social and gender Norms to End FGM".
