It was very interesting to hear their updates on their year and the what they want to do going forward and the challenges they are facing.

And this meeting is always a lovely opportunity to thank them for all their hard work and provide them each with a £200 donation.

And January started perfectly with a warm welcome to Zita our new member. I hope she finds fun, friendship and purpose in the work we do. Let's hope with work we hope to achieve this year we can continue to encourage new members and grow, because the bigger we are the more we will be able to help our charities and communities.



On the 20 January some of us had a lovely evening on zoom talking to our friendship link club SI Krakow. It was really interesting to hear about the continuing work they are doing with the Ukraine Refugees. We were told that whilst there are not so many refugees coming across the border, their work has now moved on to looking at how they can support those now living in Poland. To help them integrate better into Polish society. They are working with mums and their children as well as elderly people. We heard about the group they are setting up to support the elderly against loneliness and adapting to their new country.

Working with the mums and children, one of the projects they are keen to do is to plan a vacation for the Ukraine mums and children. They are also working with the Ukraine Consulate in Poland to help orphaned homeless children. When we asked how we could help, money is the easiest option and also not only helps their refugees but also the Polish economy by purchasing goods in their country. They have a lot of work and we hope that we will be able to help them through our fundraising events.



On the 28 January Zita and I joined the SI Libertas and SI Wakiso Zoom Cervical Cancer fundraiser event.

The event started with a video informing us of how Uganda has 2nd highest mortality rate in the world relating to Cervical Cancer. Cervical Cancer is a major issue for women in Africa and especially in Uganda.

SI Wakiso was chartered in March 2023 and SI Libertas has linked up with them as a friendship club. SI Wakiso undertook a survey of the women in their town and the issue of Cervical Cancer came out of the survey as a major issue. The club has decided for its first project to raise funds to build a cervical cancer centre. They already have the land and they have drawings for the centre.

Now they just need to raised funds. The target is £103 Uganda shillings which is roughly £21.5k for the build. The Title of Alex's talk is "The Formation and organisation of the Women's Land Army in WW1" – this is of particular interest to soroptimists because the organisation was founded in 1921, soon after WW1. During WW1, 23,000 women were employed by the Women's Land Army to work full time on the land, taking on the vital jobs in agriculture, forage production and timber cutting necessary to keep the country functioning while the men were away at war.

One surfer, Vanessa said she went surfing and her mother beat her with a pan. Surfing off the Ghanaian coast is dangerous and lives have been lost. Every few months another body would wash up on the beach.

Parents feared for their daughters with reason but also with discrimination. Whilst they have prevented girls from enjoying the beach, their boys have learned to harness the local waves. Police Officers mock body-worn video of semi-naked woman



Police officers made "sickening" comments about an assault victim while watching body-worn video showing her groin, the BBC has learned.

The woman's body was exposed when she was filmed suffering from a seizure. Three Thames Valey Police PC's later watched the footage without reason.
