


This month saw the long awaited for report on Specialist Domestic Abuse Courts (SDAC) which we as a group are proud to have taken part in.

We have already sent this report to both MP's and are in discussions with Dr Ann Limb, the current High Sherriff of Buckinghamshire who is organizing a conference on 24 November to hear the voices of 3 women who have experienced the Domestic Abuse Courts. We are hoping that this report will be mentioned at this conference because it will back up the messages from the women and because the list of invitees includes the Police, Law makers and support services.

Women in certain jobs may be more prone to ovarian cancer



Researchers have found that women who worked in accountancy for a decade were twice as likely to develop ovarian cancer, while construction workers were almost 3 times as likely.

Menopause & periods guidance is a magnificent step forward



Dame Vera Baird, former Victims Commissioner was interviewed by Channel 4 concerning a UK first. New guidance to support women with periods or going through menopause has been described as a "magnificent step forward".

In June an Inquest jury found that a domestic abuse victim, driven to suicide by coercive control, was unlawfully killed by the perpetrator. Dame Vera said the challenge is to get the CPS to bring a manslaughter prosecution. A Third of all UK female suicides follow domestic abuse.

Mothers could have missed out on £1b in state pension



Mothers may have been underpaid about £1b in state pension owing to information missing from their national insurance (NI) records.

Since 1978 the system has included credits for parents who took time out of employment to bring up children. Until 2010, this was known as home responsibilities protection (HRP), but it may be missing rom some NI records. **Click here** to read the full report. (Getty Images)

Female workers made to strip over used sanitary pad



Three people have been arrested after employees at a Kenyan cheese factory were allegedly forced to undress to check who was on their period.

A manager at Brown's Food Company assembled female workers to find out who had thrown a used sanitary towel in an incorrect bin. She made women strip after attempts to get a confession were unsuccessful. Three people are now facing indecent assault charges over the incident. Click here to read the article. (Getty Images)

Sex education must engage boys to tackle harassment - MPs



The MPs Women's and Equalities Committee recommends compulsory relationship lessons in sixth form. The Inquiry says lessons must engage boys and young men in order to tackle a scourge of sexual harassment and violence in schools. They found that some schools were still acknowledging the problem of violence against women and girls, while many lacked funding and time to deliver relationship, sex and health education effectively. Scotland's top law officer is seeking a change in the rules on evidence which could allow far more prosecutions to be brought in rape cases.

Forces failing women over police sex misconduct claims, BBC finds



Police forces are failing vulnerable women who way they have been sexually exploited by officers, the BBC has learned.

One woman says a detective pursued a sexual relationship in texts and repeatedly visited her home.

Police sexual misconduct is under the spotlight like never before following the rape and murder of Sarah Everard by serving officer Wayne Couzens and the uncovering of serial rapist David Carrick.

The BBC has learned that individual forces are failing vulnerable women in botched or delayed investigations which are taking years to complete and rarely leading to misconduct sanctions or criminal charges. **Click here** to read the full article.
