# **Editorial Welcome**

Embrace Equity, DigitAll for Women and girls were the two themes for this years International Women's Day







Our International Women's Day celebrations started the day before with our fantastic Afternoon Tea event. This year we were privileged to have Debbie Brock, High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire to speak to us about her year in office and the inspiring women she had met in that year and then we had Viktoriya Shatenko from the Ukraine

Appeal charity to speak to us about what is happening in the Ukraine and the new projects they are undertaking to support the Ukraine families here in Milton Keynes.

We had a sold-out house and a very **BIG thank you** to all our friends who came along and helped us to again raise and be able to donate £400 to SI Krakow for the work they are doing in Poland with Ukrainian families and £400 to the Ukraine Appeal here in MK. All our friends did us proud.

And we need to say a **Big thank you** to all members, baking cakes, scones, organising, decorating MK Snap and serving. And thank you to MK Snap for the use of their beautiful premises and to the learners who made our wonderful spring floral displays for the tables, they were gorgeous.



The next day I attended the IWD event at MK Theatre and on Saturday, 11 March it was lovely at last to be able to attend the London and Chilterns Regional conference in person to celebrate IWD. The themes for the day were the two IWD themes Embracing Equity and the UN theme recognizing the importance of DigitAll for women and girls. And the Conference also supported the London Chilterns Region theme for this year "The Future is ours to Challenge".

It was an inspiring and motivational day. It began with Shilla Patel, Training and Events Co-ordinator for the AVA project (Against Violence and Abuse). This project strives to improve services for survivors through training, resources and consultancy to end violence against women and girls through policy research and prevention work.

Our second speaker was Ruth Healey, President elect of Soroptimist International Great Britain and Ireland (SIGBI). Ruth spoke about the current set up of SIGBI as well as looking to the future with her thoughts for her Presidency 2023-25. Ruth's presentation linked closely to the London Chiltern theme "The Future is ours to Challenge" as she spoke about the declining membership forecast and she encouraged all clubs to make recruiting new members a top priority but to also be more outward facing, more agile, more flexible, we need to get our message out there and find out what tomorrow's members want, we need to be brave.

In the afternoon we had an update on the Domestic Violence Courts work, we had taken part in. The report should be coming out end of March to mid April and we will be asked to circulate it to all relevant persons and bodies in Milton Keynes. The next stage will be to look at the recommendations and see what ones are relevant to MK and how we can work to get them implemented. Watch this space.

We had a great meeting this March, as we welcomed Ben Thomas, Executive Director from Citizens Advice Milton Keynes to talk to us about their merger with Works For Us, our linked charity and what that means going forward.

Ben started by saying that after 4 years of collaborative working, the merger had finally gone through, slightly delayed due to the pandemic, at the beginning of 2022 and Works For us will continue to keep their own identity

CA offer support and advice and WFU the skills training to help people with their life skills and to get them back into employment. Ben said the two distinct services combine and provide a more joined up and streamlined service, unique to Milton Keynes and which is being observed by other CA's.

The merger has stimulated a lot of discussion and they are currently in talks with MacMillian Cancer and Paradigm Housing to develop training relevant to these two charities to help their users get back the skills to rebuild their lives.

We asked Ben how we could help and it was interesting to hear how, just like Age MK, CA says they need help with letting people know that they are a charity and still need funding, donations, and volunteers. Before the pandemic they had 88 volunteers and at present are down to just over 30. Any help we can give to get the message out there and help get more volunteers is important if they are to continue to provide their vital services to the community of Milton Keynes. Let's hope we can hep spread the word. It was lovely to be able to present Ben with a donation of £200.



And picking up from our Regional meeting, it was great to be able to welcome and induct Debbie into our club at our March meeting. Already Debbie is taking an active role and we hope she enjoys and gets much fulfilment from being a Soroptimist.

And I end this month's editorial on Membership. As our President Elect Ruth Healey said, we need new members, and we need to encourage new members, not just during May, our membership month but all the time.

Below are just a couple of draft posters I have started to put together for us to consider. The first one on the left was has been expanded but is as a result of an exercise we did at the Regional conference. It was called the Elevator Pitch, we were asked if you met someone in a lift (elevator) what would you tell them about being a Soroptimist in the 30 seconds (about 60 words) it would take to get between the ground floor and the 4<sup>th</sup> floor.

Below are two examples, the first is the result from the group I was in and the second from one of the other groups.

"Soroptimists are women standing up for women and girls to help achieve their full potential. We Act, Advocate, we have representation at the UN. We are doers. Being a Soroptimist gives you a purpose, makes you feel better helping others. We meet as a club, we provide friendship and support to each other. We support local charities; communities and we have a global reach."

"Soroptimist International is an organisation that supports women and girls, through practical deeds, enablement and emotional space. It's a chance to connect with my own sex and give women and girls a voice."



If we had more members, here in Milton Keynes, just think how much more we could help out our community, our charities and our projects.

I ask you that if you have any friends, neighbours please let them know about us and what we do and see if you can encourage them to join us or start by supporting us more.

But amongst ourselves we need to think of different ways to recruit more members, whether that is coffee events, putting up posters in churches, cafes, community and family centres, going to speak to other groups etc. I hope that some of you can help join our sub group to take this project forward because it is just as vital as our work with our charities.





I know I have already said this but a big thank you to all our members and friends for a great month. We always step up to the mark and deliver. And I am looking forward to what we can achieve in the year ahead.

Together we empower each other, we support each other, we can do anything

#### Ukrainian Art Exhibition - 11 March - 11 April

#### St Mark's Meals opens its 100th center



Right now, there are around 18,000 children in Milton Keynes living in poverty, roughly 9 children out of a classroom of 30.

St Mark's Meals MK has grown to support thousands of children across Milton Keynes. This local charity run by St Mary's MK, which aims to end child hunger in the city, has opened its 100th centre.

Since launching in 2019, with the aim of ensuring that no child in MK ever goes to bed hungry, St Mark's Meals has expanded across the entire city and is now accessed by 100 schools, pre-schools and children's centres. # Study in MK finds women still under represented in local politics



A recent study into the make-up of parish, town and community councils across the city has found women make up just a third of elected councillors.

The study carried out by Fawcett Society Milton Keynes, the women's rights and gender equality charity, found that of the 48 parish, town and community councils across Milton Keynes, only four had a majority of women. And in three parish councils, there was not a single female member.

MP's have approved plans to make street sexual harassment a crime carrying a jail sentence of up to two years.

Catcalling, following someone or blocking their path will become an offence in England and Wales under a bill backed by the government.

Sexual harassment is already illegal. The bill aims to improve enforcement and targets street harassment.

## Save our Pharmacies - sign the petition



Our local NHS pharmacies are on the brink of collapse, despite having proven during the pandemic that they are more needed now than ever. Since 2015, their funding has been cut by 30% and 720 pharmacies have permanently closed, putting vital NHS services at risk. Without fair funding from the Government, many more pharmacies will be forced to close.

Something the government can do straight away is to fund a 'Pharmacy First' Service in England so people with minor illnesses can be treated on the NHS by their local pharmacy, instead of having to wait to see a GP for a prescription.
