Branch meeting with the High Sheriff Buckinghamshire and Detective Superintendent Kelly Gardner







What a great way to start this year's Orange the World 16 Days of Activism at our November meeting with speakers Debbie Brock the High Sherriff of Buckingham and Kelly Gardner Detective Superintendent Domestic Abuse and Stalking.

Debbie spoke about her role in supporting the police, emergency services, councils, and all aspects of crime prevention particularly against young people. During her year she has been concentrating on modern day slavery which can lead to knife crime and has been involved in bringing the Knife Angle to Milton Keynes which will be at the StadiumMK from 3 December for the month. The Knife Angle is made from 100,000 bladed weapons.

Kelly spoke about her role with Domestic Abuse and stalking across Thames Valley. This November Thames Valley Police published their new strategy on Violence Against Women (see article later in this newsletter) and Kelly has provided us with a copy of the Domestic Abuse and Stalking Strategy.

The High Sheriff of Buckingham for 2023/24 will be Dame Ann Limb, one of our founding members, and she has said she wants to concentrate on violence against women in her year. I think it would be lovely if we could team up with her on her theme. And so, for xmas reading I hope you are all able to have a read of these new strategies and we can discuss at our planning meeting in January.

Violence against women: The families demanding change



Families whose mums, sisters and daughters were killed by men are calling for changes to the way police and authorities deal with violence against women. They want changes to how killers are sentenced and to the way the NHS and social services respond.

According to the latest official crime statistics - between April 2020 and March 2021 - 177 women were murdered in England and Wales. Of those, 109 were killed by a man, 10 were killed by a woman, and in

58 cases there was no known suspect. The latest figures also show 1.7 million women experienced domestic abuse last year. The bereaved families have formed a new campaign group, called Killed Women, to campaign for more to be done to protect women and ensure justice for victims. **Click here for the full story.**

Soroptimist International - Statement on the rights of women and girls



Soroptimists International released a statement on 4 November, linked to the growing protests across Iran continue in response to the death of the young woman, Mahsa Amini. Soroptimist International is deeply concerned that this is just one example of the human rights of women and girls being suppressed in many countries across the globe. Soroptimist International rigorously opposes such violations of human rights and calls on the Iranian Government and all other Governments to cease state-

controlled violence against unarmed women and girls immediately, and to comply with international laws protecting the right to freedom of expression and elimination of gender discrimination. Click here to read full statement.

2 Dec - End Modern Day Slavery - County Lines





County lines' is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs into one or more importing areas within the UK, using dedicated mobile phone lines or other form of "deal line".

They are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults to move and store the drugs and money and they will often use coercion, intimidation, violence (including sexual violence) and weapons.

Women's Equality - Women's abortion rights being undermined



Abortion rights in the UK are under threat... again. When the government announced that they were going to make access to early at-home abortions permanent Women's Equality were elated. Since 2018, they have campaigned for early at-home abortion pills to be made accessible to anyone who needs them and this was a significant win for women in the UK. However, following

the third reshuffle of 2022, the new cabinet have threatened to limit women's access to safe abortions In a recent leak, it was revealed that abortion providers have been instructed to limit access to at-home abortions to those without a registered address - this doesn't include refuges, hotels, hostels, or even family homes. This new rule will disproportionately affect the most vulnerable women in our society, and could force women seeking sanctuary from domestic abuse back to their abuser's home. This is not only nonsensical, but a direct attack on our reproductive rights. According to an email sent by the Department of Health and Social Care to abortion providers, the *fifty* year old Abortion Act is being used to restrict the rights of marginalised women and reverse the progress made this year.

Women's Equality say we must not let these perpetual attempts made by anti-choicers in Rishi Sunak's cabinet turn the clock back on our reproductive rights

Landmark Breast Cancer drug could save thousands of lives



'The treatment is far less debilitating than chemotherapy and I've been given the gift of a longer life,' says one patient. A targeted drug for those with advanced forms of the disease reduced tumours as well as doubling the length of time patients have before their disease develops.

A phase III clinical trial of capivasertib alongside hormone therapy suggests the combination could become the new treatment for patients with advanced forms of the most common type of breast cancer.

The findings, presented at the San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium on Thursday, are relevant for around seven in 10 of all new breast cancer cases.


Sustainable Warmth Grant
