UKPAC Oct #Orange the World campaign-Spiking is a serious offence



Drink spiking is when someone puts drugs or alcohol into a person's drink without their knowledge or consent. It can include putting alcohol into a non-alcoholic drink, adding extra alcohol to an alcoholic drink or slipping prescription or illegal drugs (such as tranquilisers, amphetamines or GHB — liquid ecstasy) into an alcoholic or non-alcoholic drink. It can be difficult to tell whether a drink has been spiked, as substances used for spiking usually have no taste, odour or colour. To read the full article click here.

Next stage of #Enough campaign on violence against women launched







Through our Football United Against Domestic Violence campaign, we know all too well that football players and fans have a vital role in helping change attitudes and responses towards abuse and violence against women.

As a result, The Home Office has launched the nest stage of its #Enough campaign with GOAL— developed with Women's Aid— to "raise awareness of football-related abuse towards women in England and Wales" and to

promote the idea that "the responsibility to end domestic violence and sexual harassment against women and girls lies amongst our men and boys."

By now, you may have heard the oft-repeated statistic that domestic violence increases by 38% when the England team lose, peaking around 10 hours after kick-off.

The campaign is fronted by Josh Denzel, sports presenter who talks about how men can intervene to ensure that sexist attitudes have no place within the so-called beautiful game. There are simple ways to tackle this.
