A very big Thank you Rowena, our Soroptimist friend. This month she gave us 11 beautiful handmade quilts which we donated to YMCA MK.

These quilts will be given to residents in the Supported Living Stage 1 of the 3 stages YMCA have to help people.

Stage 1 are new residents who will be given advice, help and new skills to start them back on their journey to getting back into employment and a place to live. These quilts help them get their dignity back and to know they are cared for and will go with them on their journey.





At our September branch meeting it was lovely to be able to officially welcome Rosella to our group. I hope she enjoys the friendship we share and also the work we do to help our charities and our community. Welcome Rosella.

And our September meeting also included Louisa Hobbs, Operations Manager from MK Foodbank, thank you for such an inspirational talk. We learned that the foodbank provides two services: Emergency support – people can be given two emergency parcels only 6 times a vear. The foodbank has seen in the last year a 30% increase in requests.

<u>Top Up Shop</u> – this service is for people to buy things cheaper. 10 items for $\pounds 10$ and also provides help with debt support. 1000 people currently signed up.

They have seen a drastic reduction in donations and are now looking at developing a mobile door collection service as well as a mobile top up shop.



So please everyone share this news with all your friends and ask if they can donate what ever will help others.



On the 30 September we were on the Stony radio station with Thia promoting our Music Concert on 8 October and also a little bit about Soroptimists. Well done Rosella for enabling this opportunity and well-done Jean. Yet another bow Jean to your continuing new skills you are notching up as a Soroptimist. In fact, Jean did so well we have been invited back on 7 October to speak some more about Soroptimists and what we stand for and do. So, listen out for us on the lunch time show at 1pm.

Victims Commissioner

SIGBI are supporting a project set up by Dame Vera Beard, the ex-Government Victims Commissioner, to carry out some research as to the effectiveness of domestic violence courts.

We have been observing local domestic violence courts in Milton Keynes along with SI colleagues from Aylesbury.

Between us all we have observed 12 different sessions observing a variety of cases, some in their entirety and mostly part cases. We have completed the questionnaires which are being collated with those from other Soroptimist clubs across the UK and which will eventually mean a report of the findings will be presented to the government and local authorities /court authorities. We learnt a lot from this experience and reported a lot ! Thanks to Vanessa, Jean, Mala and Sue P for their contributions to this research.

On 1 October some of our members had the privilege of attending a zoom meeting with Soroptimist International Krakow to find out how they have been supporting refugees from

Ukraine. Karina Mostowik, President of Soroptimist Poland welcomed everyone from around the world (Australia, New Zealand, Belgium, France, Italy, UK but to name a few) to the meeting. She told us that 6.5 million refugees had come to Poland. Of the 3m plus that had stayed, 50% were children and young people up to 18 and of the adults 95% were women of which 10% were older women. The stories they were told were horrific and showed a picture one of the children had drawn of their experience. Anna WSZELACZYŃSKA, Soroptimist Krakow updated the meeting on the 2 main projects they undertook with the help of all the donations to support these refugees.

They set up two main projects to support the refugees as they arrived. This included feeding, clothing and providing advice, support and housing on their arrival. Taking food packages down to the train and bus station and helping to get them medical support and advice. The other project concentrated on providing educational, medical and psychological support. You will see a picture above of a picture drawn by one of the children, you can not imagine the impact on that childs life. They set up language lessons for the adults and children, get them drawing and playing and got them to take part in a play. They linked up with a charity to give support to the pregnant mothers, which included birthing classes, breastfeeding classes, psychological support and workshops.

Anna WSZELACZYŃSKA, Soroptimist Krakow, thanked all donors. But she said this is a long term issue. Just recently they received a letter from a Hospital in the Ukraine asking for medical supplies. And the people they have here need long term support, to acclimatise to a new culture and get support to be able to get jobs and a home. If people can still donate they will be able to continue their work.

"Never forget about Humanity", one donor said, SI Krakow were a shining example of how they had picked up the challenge and were working at the coal face to help these people. And we thank them and hope that our Music event can raise some more vital funds for them.



Not long now till International Day of the Elimination of Violence Against Women and the start of 16 Days of Activism, which is supported by Soroptimists around the world, through the Orange the World campaign. There is also the White Ribbon Campaign which engages with men and boys to raise awareness and educate them to end violence against women and girls.

White Ribbon is the world's largest movement of men and boys working to end violence against women and girls, promote gender equity, healthy relationships and a new vision of masculinity. The

campaign began in Canada in 1991 and is now present in over 60 countries around the world.

The White Ribbon Promise

Central to the campaign is to encourage people, especially men and boys, to wear a White Ribbon and to make the White Ribbon Promise: **never use, excuse or remain silent about male violence against women and girl.** White Ribbon UK is the leading charity that works with men and boys, campaigning and educating to change the cultures that lead to abuse and stop violence before it starts and was one of the voluntary sector organisations that contributed to the development of the new national communications campaign – **'Enough**' – launched by the Home Secretary on 1 March 2022– to raise awareness of the different forms of violence against women and girls and the simple acts that anyone can take to challenge perpetrators of abuse.

The 2022 White Ribbon Campaign theme is **#The Goal** because the 25 November falls in the same week as the launch of the FIFA men's World Cup. There has never been a better time to focus on the good that can come from

unifying and supporting one common cause. **#TheGoal** does just that, it brings men and boys together to think about how they can make a positive difference to achieve equality and safety for women and girls.

Anthea Sully, Chief Executive of White Ribbon UK shared, "This year we are addressing how informal rules about 'how to be a man' and 'how to be a woman' can restrict the way men, women, girls, and boys are expected to live. These behaviours can be harmful and create environments that normalise violence against women and girls.

#TheGoal highlights eleven traits that men and boys can nurture, each representing a player in a football team.



- 1. Caring
- 2. Empathetic
- 3. Reflective
- 4. Gentle
- 5. Courageous
- 6. Resilient
- 7. Reliable
- 8. Hopeful
- 9. Principled
- 10. Supportive
- 11. Ally

It calls on the need to shift expectations that violent and abusive behaviour and attitudes are normal and cannot be changed. All men and boys can commit to equality and safety for women and girls to live the lives they want to lead without fear of violence. This is always #TheGoal.

The White Ribbon UK team launched the 2022 #The Goal campaign at the Calder High School, where they were welcomed by the Head Teacher and members of the school's football teams. To read about the launch and the reaction from the girls and the boys football players **click here**.

We are talking to and hoping to work with Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Council, MK Council and MK Dons to see what campaigns we can run over this 16 Days of Activism to raise awareness of this important issue, so watch this space. And we hope Milton Keynes Council is successful in applying for and achieving White Ribbon Accreditation.

The Winter season shall soon be upon us which means putting in place our Xmas projects from us to our charities. We are hoping to provide Xmas lunch at the YMCA for the 30 supported residents on Sat 10 December and are still in discussions so will let you know as soon as the details have been finalised. For the Winter Night Shelter we are planning a buffet to take on 6 December. And we will let you know what MK Act want this year but our thoughts are to provide food vouchers for the families. I hope we will all be able to help in whatever way we can with our annual xmas projects.

But before then, our next fundraising event is our Music Event on Saturday 8 October at The Mead Centre Newport Pagnell, kindly put on by Karen and her friends. We are hoping to raise funds for both the Winter Night Shelter and also the Ukraine Crisis. As reported a little earlier, Sue P and a few members attended an amazing zoom meeting with SI Krakow to learn how donations received from a number of SI clubs around the world had helped and what more help they need as this crisis continues to devastate the country and its people.

The next few months are going to be busy. There will be the **11 November Remembrance Day** at MK Rose from 10.45am to 11am. And at our **branch meeting on 22 November**, we are lucky to have the High Sheriff of Buckingham, Debbie Brock coming along to talk to us about her plans for work with violence towards women. I hope you will all be able to make that meeting as it sounds like it will be very interesting and a great way to start off the 16 Days of Activism. We have two craft events on **23 Nov at MK Snap and 26 Nov at the Mead Center**, Newport Pagnell (same day the Xmas lights are switched on) and if anyone can help out on those days please let Sue P know asap. And of course the **16 Days of Activism starting on 25 November**, the International Day of Elimination of Violence against women. Let us all help to raise awareness, OrangeMK and Say no to Violence against Women. Thank you everyone for all your hard work.
