Before I sum up what we did in September, MK Act is bidding for a cash boost from the Tesco Stronger Starts scheme. Stronger Starts provides grant awards of up to £1,500 to local community projects, with a particular focus on children and young people.

MK Act is one of three community groups shortlisted in Milton Keynes to receive grant awards and from October to Mid-January 2025 Tesco customers can vote using a blue

token, find them at the check-out each time you shop. MK Act is on the shortlisted for its Friendly Foodies, an initiative based at the women's refuge centered around the joy of learning new cookery skills, enhancing nutrition and health, reducing food waste and fostering a sense of community for survivors of abuse. "We did it" Next shop workers win equal pay claim



More than 3,500 current and former workers at Next have won the final stage of a six-year legal battle for equal pay.

An employment tribunal said store staff, who are predominantly women, should not have been paid at lower rates than employees in warehouses, where just over half the staff are male. Lawyers for the shop staff described the judgement as "hugely significant" and the amount of back-pay owed could amount to more than £30m.

### "Women and children not protected from male harm"



A probation service is "not effectively responding to or reducing the potential harm perpetrated by men against women and children", according to inspectors.

Probation services in the East of England have received a rating of "requires improvement" from His Majesty's Inspectorate of Probation. The report highlighted risk assessments being completed without referencing information about child safeguarding and domestic abuse. A Ministry of Justice spokesperson said the new government

### Woman with cancer warns of rare breast implant risk



A woman who developed a rare type of cancer linked to her breast implants has warned that others with similar implants could be "walking around like timebombs". Susan Axelby, 68, was recently paid £57,000 by Allergan Limited after she fell ill with breast implant associated anaplastic large-cell lymphoma (BIA-ALCL). ### Social workers lack training to tackle coercive abuse, BBC finds out



Coercive and controlling behaviour (CCB) has been a criminal offence in the UK since 2015. It isolates and harms victims using psychological abuse, and is now accepted to underpin all domestic abuse. Campaigners say understanding CCB is vital. However, nine years on from the law change, a BBC investigation has found more than a third of accredited university social work courses in England are not teaching specific training on coercive control. ### "Extremely early days" for combined authority plan



Jack Shaw, a local government expert and senior adviser for think tank Labour Together, posted on X,that six councils - Milton Keynes, Bedford, Central Bedfordshire, Luton, West Northamptonshire and North Northamptonshire - were considering submitting an "expression of interest" in a South Midlands Combined Authority. A combined authority brings together existing local authorities but does not replace them, and supports councils to work together across a wider geographic area on issues such as transport and housing. Ten have been set up across England, including

### Woman becomes first in UK to get new MS injection



A woman with multiple sclerosis (MS) has become the first person in the UK to receive a new "game-changer" 10-minute injection.

The medication ocrelizumab, which helps to prevent relapses and slow the progression of MS, has now been approved as an injection and the first dose was given at Morriston Hospital and took just 10 minutes. Normally it would be an intravenous (IV) infusion twice a year taking up to 4 hours each time.

Two women who say they were raped and strangled by the controversial social media influencer Andrew Tate have spoken to the BBC about their experiences.
