The UN 16 Days of Activism has been taking place from 25 November till 10 December. We have been busy on our social media platforms promoting this year's theme, #WiredForChange, agreed by Soroptimist International, raising awareness about the impact technology has had on gender-based violence and abuse. The message is we need to make technology safe for everyone, where everyone is treated with respect and dignity online and offline.

# Milton Keynes to be a super hub in King Charles new scheme to tackle food poverty



King Charles is setting up a huge new scheme called the Coronation Food Project, with the aim of rescuing surplus food from growers, manufacturers and retailers then redirecting it to the people who need it most.

Milton Keynes was created in 1960s as a way of easing housing shortages in London. But five decades later it was facing a housing crisis of its own, dubbed "tent city" in the media because of the encampments of rough sleepers dotted around the centre.

Fears force failed to protect people at risk after Clare's Law applicants given wrong information.

Wiltshire Police Force is reviewing thousands of applications made under the Clare's Law, which gives people the right to ask whether a partner has a violent past, after it came to light that wrong or incomplete information has been given.


