Conference Speakers

Dr Erinma Bell OBE DL JP - *Transforming Lives in an Urban Environment*

How to employ a successful model that 'builds social capital' amongst grass roots and key stakeholders. How do you employ methods which 'transport and transform individuals' to bring about peace? Erinma will give examples of her work around issues such as Restorative Justice, Conflict Resolution as well as Peace Making, Keeping and Building within an urban environment.

Steph Sherratt, Breaking Barriers NW - A Celebration of Difference

Breaking Barriers is a twofold organisation founded by 3 parents of disabled children with various requirements. Steph, one of the founding parents, talks about diversity and difference being positive things and how raising awareness and effectively challenging the barriers to inclusion faced by children can make a real difference to the lives of their families.

Gail Newsham - Pride of Preston – The Dick, Kerr Ladies

Dick, Kerr's Ladies FC was one of the earliest known women's association football teams in England. Formed at a munitions factory during WW1 to raise funds for wounded soldiers, the Dick, Kerr Ladies went on to become the most successful team ever. Gail is the original biographer of their history and author of 'In a League of their Own!'

Chris Green OBE, White Ribbon (UK) - Men Challenging Male Violence against Women

Christopher Green is Founder and President of White Ribbon (UK) In the 1980's he was a member of the Achilles Heel Magazine Collective, worked on the anti-sexist Mens Newsletter, and developed a database of all the anti-domestic violence projects funded through the European Commission Daphne programme.

Flowa Houldsworth, Medecins Sans Frontieres - Breaking the Barriers of Cultural Differences

Doctors without Borders (MSF) is a medical humanitarian organisation that delivers emergency aid in more than 70 countries to people affected by armed conflict, epidemics and natural or man-made disasters. Assistance is offered based on need, irrespective of race, religion, gender or political affiliation.

Rosie Dummer, aka Rosie Cake-Diva - The Sky's the Limit

Two decades before the British Army officially allowed women on the front line, Captain Rosie Dummer became the first female Lynx Anti-Tank Helicopter Pilot with the Army Air Corps. Rosie charts her unorthodox path from flying choppers to baking extreme cakes on Channel 4 and proves that life is not defined by one career.
