£5 buys one chicken. Your chicken will be looked after by a family in Kumi, Uganda. Owning a chicken brings hope and independence. With a chicken a family can use the eggs to feed themselves, breed with other chickens and sell the offspring, and begin to build a future for themselves. So a chicken is not just a chicken - its a chance to make their life better.



£25 buys you a goat. Your goat will be looked after by a family in Kumi, Uganda. Owning a goat brings status and value . With a goat a family can breed with other goats and sell the offspring, and begin to build a future for themselves . So a goat is not just a goat - its a chance to make their life better.



£75 buys a prosthetic limb. In rural Eastern Uganda, being disabled may mean not having the opportunity to go to school, have a job, or a future. A new prosthetic limb can bring independence and dignity to disabled adults and children, giving them the ability to create a future for themselves and their families. All limbs are made in the workshop of Kumi Hospital - so your gift is not only helping a disabled person but also keeping valuable craftsmen employed.



£125 buys a new wheelchair. Being born disabled in rural Eastern Uganda often means no school, no independence and no hope. With your gift of a wheelchair a child can return to school, get an education and can work and provide for his or her family. Rather than being a burden on their families, children with wheelchairs can become an equal member of the family.
