Programme Action Report

After the success and excitement of our Miyawaki forest, this month has been less eventful, Programme Action wise.

Three members (Audrey, Viv and Lynda) got together one sunny





afternoon to plant up 6 hanging baskets which had been requested by Umuada Refuge. A few members donated the empty baskets, and the result is shown above. A very enjoyable afternoon spent chatting and planting. Irene has delivered them to the refuge.

After the blister pack recycling scheme was set to finish at the end of May Superdrug have since been given the go ahead to continue with the recycling programme, but it is being taken out of local pharmacies due to pharmacy misuse and Terra-cycle being inundated with blister packs from chemist waste rather than public.

STOP PRESS! Terra-cycle is now advertising home & office recycle boxes (with costs) and are now showing products that can be ordered and made with recycled plastics like garden

furniture.



You can save your blister packs and we will collect them at our first face to face meeting to take to Superdrug. but in the meantime please don't send them to landfill... Take them to your nearest Superdrug.
