Women Walking Together Towards Freedom From Rape And Abuse

On 8th December, members took part in a march through the streets of Perth organised by RASAC (Rape & Sexual Abuse Centre). The march was to protest at all forms of violence against women and children and to reclaim our right to walk the streets at night.

We assembled in the Women's Centre in West Mill St., alongside the Pipe Band and drummers. With over a hundred marchers, the Band and a police escort, we walked through the streets into the High Street, ending at the Council offices where tea/coffee and cakes were waiting for us.

The Provost welcomed us in the newly renovated Council Chambers and congratulated the marchers for their dedication and commitment to ending violence against women.
