Project Groups

Fresh Thoughts: This group maintains, updates and distributes the Fresh Thoughts (Wiltshire) booklet jointly with SI Swindon, an information resource for women fleeing domestic abuse.

Salisbury Women’s Refuge: The group works to support our local Women’s Refuge and brings suggestions for initiatives to the Club.

Making our City Safer: This group works to make the city a safer place for women and girls, carrying out nighttime street and Ask for Angela audits as well as other activities

Health Matters: The group has had a focus on women on the autism spectrum, but considers all women’s health issues

Lobbying and Advocacy: This group horizon scans and researches topics that require our lobbying and advocacy work and brings them to the Club.

Microfinance: This group researches and makes regular microfinance loans on behalf of the Club to women in the developing world

Annual Bra Collection (May to July) The group organises and delivers the annual appeal and collection of recycled bras for donation to charity
