Elsa is one of two surviving Charter members of S.I. San Fernando and continues to participate in club activities after 58 years. She has twice served as Club President and Secretary and has led several committees over the years. She also made a great contribution in the early years to the setting up the Club's Home for the Elderly and continues to take an interest in the Home.

Elsa was part of the delegation that initiated discussions on the formation of the SI Caribbean network, then called the Caribbean Area Council and worked tirelessly to ensure that it came into being. In the early days she attended all Caribbean Conferences and also attended Federation Conferences and SI Conventions representing Trinidad & Tobago.

Elsa also represented S.I. San Fernando at meetings and conferences abroad, a notable one being a friendship meeting of a Washington D.C. Club. On this occasion she met with some staff and students of the Gallaudet University and established an important link with the then principal of the Audrey Jeffers School for the Deaf.

Elsa has been very active in the Anglican Church and served as the Rector's warden in the parish of St. Paul. She was also a member of the Diocesan Council of the Anglican Diocese of Trinidad and Tobago.

She has served on several Boards including the Board of Management of Mothers' Union Children's Home. She has given tireless service to the Board of St. Stephen's College and of Early Child Care & Education as well as the Adoption Board of Trinidad & Tobago.

She was the Vice-President of the Chest & Heart Association (Southern Branch) and a Member of St. Hilary's Foundation (Bishop Anstey High School).

She has given long and sacrificial service to Club and Country.
