The first half of the calendar year kept Woking Soroptimists extremely busy. In January, we held an awareness-raising evening about the government's 'Dementia Friends' initiative. In April we marked the end of our Soroptimist year with a cheese and wine party that raised £355 for yourSanctuary. In May we held a book sale to raise funds for Samber (Riding for the Disabled) and, together with SI Weybridge, organised the third edition of our successful Tea & Temptations event that raised £1659.50 for the Birthing in the Gambia project.
