V.I.P. - an opportunity to work with carers in South Africa

Thank you for showing interest in this new Soroptimist sponsored volunteering opportunity.

The first placement, starting in October 2016 will be with the Tateni Home Care Nursing Service. Tateni is a not-for-profit organisation that provides after-school activities for HIV/AIDS orphans. These sessions are a vital extension to the core work of the project, which offers home-based support to HIV/AIDS affected child or granny-headed households in Mamelodi and the surrounding area in South Africa.

Makgatho Primary School in a western suburb of Pretoria is highly respected and is the location for the second opportunity. The third placement is a live-in post in the Winterveldt, where The Sisters of Mercy run Diabetes and HIV/AIDS clinics. The internationally known Mapula Embroidery Project is part of the Sisters' highly successful empowerment initiative. Teaching local women new skills enables them to earn money to support their families and improve their standard of living.

Tateni staff and the Sisters of Mercy deliver wide programmes of assistance to families in a country where there is a huge need and demand for support services. UNICEF reports that there are approximately 3.7 million orphans in South Africa, about half of whom have lost one or both parents to AIDS.

Soroptimist International of Southern England has strong ties with sister Soroptimists in South Africa and especially Pretoria and Tshwane. SI is an all women organisation that is committed to educating, empowering and enabling girls and women globally. This opportunity is open to an inspired young woman who is keen to offer her time and talents to help others, learn new skills and gain experience. She should be confident enough to face the challenge of a new environment and culture and above all have excellent interpersonal skills. This will enable her to work happily as part of a team and ensure that she maintains a meaningful relationship with the South African Soroptimists who will act as hosts during her stay.

1. Tateni Home Care Nursing Services

During her seven-month stay at Tateni, the volunteer will live with the Executive Director Regina Mogkogong and travel to the office with her. Each weekday morning she will be required to undertake office-based administrative tasks to support the work of the Tateni Home Care Nursing Staff. Some home visits might be possible. The weekday after-school centre provides personal and educational support for the 45 orphans and vulnerable children who are currently registered with Tateni. Involvement in the service provision at the after-school centre will include some of the following:

- homework support
- helping children with their reading in the new school library
- assisting with art and craft activities
- supporting dance, music or drama session

2. Makgatho Primary School

The Principal, Jane Tsharane is hugely appreciative of volunteering support and welcomes the input from an intern from the UK. The placement will focus on reading help for the students. 3. Sisters of Mercy Community Centre - Winterveldt

This is a unique opportunity for the intern to spend a month with the Sisters of Mercy in a quieter and more rural area. It is a residential placement and the volunteer will support Centre staff delivering social development programmes in:

- HIV/AIDS and/or Diabetes clinics
- Adult and children's literacy sessions
- a home industry initiative including the Mapula embroidery project

- ❖ V.I.P. is a joint initiative between Soroptimist International of Southern England and Soroptimist International of Pretoria.
- SI Clubs in Southern England will be supporting the placement financially, but the successful candidate will be expected to contribute £1,000 towards costs. She must also take out her own health and travel insurance.
- A Visa is required to enable an intern to work in South Africa and medical and radiological examinations must be undertaken.
- During the nine-month project, Members of SI Pretoria will act as co-hosts and provide some leisure activities and opportunities for sight-seeing.
- The volunteer will be asked to write a blog for the SISE website, send monthly updates to let SI Members know how things are progressing and give a presentation to a SISE Regional Meeting on her return.
