- The making of A4 size blackboards for children in the villages























































SNAKE BITE NJOKA IKALUMA



Do Zinthu Zofunika Ucita

1. Keep the person calm. Msungeni munthu modenkha

2. Tell the person to keep very still. Muuzeni munthu kuti akhale cokhala

3. Immobilise the arm or leg to keep still. Osagundanitsa manja kapena minyendo, zizi tayana

4. Rush the person to the hospital. Thamanganayeni munthu kucipatala





Do Not Zinthu Zosafunika Kucita

1. Do not take person to the traditional healer. Osamupeleka munthau kwa asing'anga.

2. Do not give herbal mixture to the person. Osamupatsa mankhala ya zitsamba munthu

3. Do not cut, burn or suck the bite or skin. Osatema mpini, utetha kapena kuyamwa malo olumiwa.

4. Do not tie a ligature around the arm or leg. Osamaga thambo ku dzanja kapena ku

mwendo kolumidwa



Do Zinthu Zofunika Ucita

1. Protect from injury remove person from fire and hard objects.


Tetezani kucoka kuzopweteka mcotseni Munthu kucoka ku moto ndikuzipagizo zolimba.

4 Take the person to hospital not the clinic. Mpelekeni kucipatala.
