Care of Membership and Safeguarding

- A definition of Safeguarding
 - to protect the health, well-being and human rights of individuals, which allow people—especially children, young people and vulnerable adults—to live free from abuse, harm and neglect.
- An adult may be defined as being vulnerable if they are aged 18 or over and are unable to look after themselves, protect themselves from harm or exploitation or are unable to report abuse.
- everyone is vulnerable in some way and at certain times, some people will have higher levels of vulnerability than others.





Vulnerabilities

These can include:

- Disability
- Ill Health
- Survivor of abuse
- Age-related fragility
- Bereavement
- Victim of a crime

GDPR

- Remember not to pass on personal information unless you have permission

Social Media

 - No-one should have to give a reason why they don't want to be on our social media whether that is by photo, video, name.
- Group Photos Before taking a group photo make sure everyone is aware it is for social media - that way people can choose to leave the group before the photo is taken.
- Risk Assessments Social Media risk assessments can be created for events
- Full disclosure If you are going to post a picture of someone check you have consent not just or the picture, but also for their name too.
