Our Founding Sisters:

Tiverton & District Soroptimists held their inaugural meeting on 12th February 1964 in the Mayoral Room at the Town Hall.

The Club has held monthly meetings for over 56 years and contributed much to the local community.

My interest in our club history began with our current attendance book. I studied the names and wanted to know more.

The icing on the cake was the discovery of the original minute book 1964-68. This had been carefully handwritten by Founding Member (later Club President) Dr. Gillian Esther Sladden, a highly respected Clare House Doctor.

I started reading and transcribing the minutes digitally, as this was our only copy. The book was a page-turner and I was hooked.



It became the ideal 2020 lockdown project for me and I enlisted the support of current Tiverton Soroptimists, whose collective membership exceeds 175 years.

In the next newsletter I will be sharing stories of our Founding Sisters with you.

Who were these inspiring women?

What was their motivation?

What did they achieve in Tiverton?



Today, I am honoured to share a photo of Dr. Gillian *Sladden, who went into such detail to capture* the words and spirit of the early club meetings.

Friendship Links for Tiverton Soroptimists:

When I first joined the Soroptimist International Club in Tiverton some 20 years ago, it took me a long time to work out how Friendship Links formed part of the clubs' history.


We currently have a Friendship Link with Gouda in the Netherlands, which had been very active years before; however, we'd heard nothing from the link for many years.

Looking back at photos I could see our members had visited Gouda and had returned the hospitality here in Tiverton. It often happens though, when someone leaves a club or dies or the link in the country loses an address.

I like a challenge, so I decided that we were going to reconnect and we were going to visit.



We did indeed visit Gouda famed for the cheese and a beautiful cathedral and had a fantastic time visiting windmills and other places of interest.





We returned their hospitality and were delighted to welcome them at Exeter airport for a long weekend stay.

There is always a warm welcome when Soroptimists get together. If you meet another Soroptimist anywhere in the world, you will find friendship, and members are always invited to attend their club meetings.

My next aim is to see if we can arrange to have a zoom meeting with members of SI Gouda in the New Year.

I have been a Friendship Officer for about 15 years, and this was the first Officer post I undertook.

We also started a Friendship Link with Kobe in Japan, and I was fortunate to have been given a Gift of Friendship. The clubs in the area passed me to the care of one club after another. In all, I visited five clubs, all very different.

This trip took place in 2015 and 1995 after there had been a devastating earthquake and tourists had stopped visiting.

The Tourist Board worked with the Soroptimists to pay for a visit for myself and another member of their club's Friendship link, which was a lady called Cesarina from Australia. (We are still in contact today).

All of our accommodation and meals (the food was delicious) were paid for by the clubs and the Japanese Tourist Board, and we stayed in the most incredible hotels, in suites with outstanding views. We had a home stay each, which was fascinating and so different.



Friendship Links for Tiverton Soroptimists: Cont.

We have a couple of new links, and I look after SI Jersey, which are a very progressive group; it is worth looking at their website to see all they achieve.

As a club, we support 'Empowering Girls in Nepal'.

We sent in five stories, and although we did not win, we helped a very good cause. The money we raised helped girls in Nepal who are the victims of rape, trafficking and violence, to have a new safe home and an education.

We are often invited as Soroptimists, to join in with other areas Zoom meetings. This month I linked up with East Grinstead Soroptimists.

Their speaker was Melissa Thorpe, Head of Engagement at Spaceport Cornwall and leading spokesperson for the project, (and point of contact for the community, politicians and industry). https://spaceportcornwall.com.

She has six years of experience within the aerospace and aviation industry.

We also have a link with a club in New Zealand; another member, Jenny, looks after them, and she can tell us more about that one.

All Friendship links receive cards and emails from us, so we keep in touch and support each other. We have received a Christmas parcel from SI Kobe, Japan for us to share, containing sweet treats, small origami boxes and a Christmas card.

Our new Friendship Club in New Zealand:




Jenny circulated a welcome newsletter from our newest Friendship Club: Soroptimists International of Taupo.

Recent talks at the SW SI Regional Meeting

<u>James Woolridge</u> spoke about living with Mental Health, the support he'd had and how he is helping others even though he continues to struggle.

As a young person James was an extrovert but became troubled and a worrier as a teenager. He found it difficult to settle at anything, despite being talented.

He joined the military and gained a place at Wellbeck College.

During this time his parents divorced.



After A' Levels he went on to Sandhurst. The pressures he felt here, and his vulnerability, caused him to have a 'meltdown'. As a result, he was taken to hospital and given various medications. He was given a Mental Health diagnosis and was told that he would be unlikely to get a job. However, Mole Valley Farmers took him on, and he met his wife of 26 years there, who is his 'rock'.

Since then he has been sectioned many times.

Eight years ago, after becoming very unwell, he set up The Recovery Den which promotes and supports mental recovery.

He has produced many Podcasts and videos to help during Lockdown.

James has helped produce a leaflet with the Devon Partnership NHS Trust, 'Five Ways to Well-Being'. He believes there is a potential tsunami ready to overwhelm services. The crisis is ever present. He suggests that we use our own communities to be supportive rather than relying on a service.

Leigh Rundle spoke about Deri, her mother, who set up the Living Legacy Trust to help reduce the poverty and deprivation she had witnessed in Rwanda. Raising over £400,000 she helped build a community health project, install clean water facilities, promote better education, housing, health and family planning. For 24 years she worked on these projects until her death. Deri has been awarded the first British Citizen's Award for international Achievement.

Leigh set up an Education fund to support 5 children between 11-25,

in their secondary education. She has also set up a food programme to support families struggling for basic food during the pandemic.

Thomas gave a most informative talk about the work of Mary's Meals which provides food for children in countries around the world whose governments don't run programmes to feed school children.

Most of the work is undertaken by local volunteers, using food grown locally, and appropriate for the diet of the children in the area.

She felt it was worth all the hard work to see so many excellent speakers and enjoy the warmth of their companionship.

To celebrate the Centenary project 'PlantTrees for a Brilliant Future', we have set up a working party to explore our options.

Tiverton Soroptimist Elaine Greensmith took part in a Webinar facilitated by Sultan Ahmed Ismail PhD, D.Sc, Director of Ecoscience Research Foundation, Chennai.

Elaine reported her findings to our December Club meeting.

She talked about the idea of planting fruit trees in school grounds, as this would be a way to help feed the children and awaken an interest in nature.

Programme Action Coordinator - Bridget Tosh said that Tiverton & District Soroptimists have always worked closely with local schools and we agreed to look into this more closely.

Elaine will feedback to us from the next PlantTrees webinar.



Tiverton & District Soroptimist have been supporting <u>Housing Action Team CHAT Charity</u> <u>Devon Free Housing Advice (chatmid.org)</u> for over 25 years.

We normally operate a club rota, taking it in turns to make monthly food/household donations to the much needed CHAT food bank.

Daphne and Jenny were invited to visit the food bank when CHAT moved to Coggan's Well House.

Since the start of the pandemic this food bank has never been more needed.

Tiverton Soroptimists have been making direct payments to them, as it is evolving such that more of us give online as we cannot get to the shops.



At least that way CHAT can make certain that what is needed turns up in their 'shop'

We will continue our support for this wonderful Tiverton Charity.

The Tiverton Sundarban Support Group.

Over the last 30 years, our group has been working with and providing annual support to a Northern Bangladesh village.

During the last three years however, the charity has been preparing to close.

This was as a result of the preschool education programme becoming more able to support itself and additional government clinics being developed in the area.

The deadline for closure was December 31st 2020.

the decision was taken to hold over the remaining funds to cover any future crisis in the village.

When Covid arrived, all the government clinics were closed, and it was decided to use the money to reinstate the health programme with many members of the original team.

At the end of June, the clinics reopened with the health team visiting all the village areas seeing on average 600 patients with varying health needs each week. They have now received the final funds but as a result of the link, two more charities have emerged which need to improve living conditions.

For the last ten years, SAFE has been working to improve house building in the area.

They demonstrated how houses could be improved using readily available materials—treating the bamboo so that it doesn't rot and raising the level of the homes above flood level etc.

Recently, our group heard a speaker who told us about a new charity called AZUKO.

This charity is also associated with house building, plus they work with women in designing better kitchens and cooking facilities. Using improved designs, allows the women to cook without the need to crouch on the earth floor and inhale the smoke from the wood fires.

We may well support this project as a club in the future.
