For the past couple of years SI Port Talbot have supported Friends of Monze - a charity which supports Monze a small township in Zambia. We have collected books for both children and for teaching adults thus enabling the local school to continue to work with youngsters in the area. We have also supported them through monetary donations

## **Empower**

Tools for Self Reliance – this is a project that SI Port Talbot has supported for a number of years and last weekend saw a number of members gathering tools in Pontardawe for the first time (we feel we have saturated Port Talbot town centre for now!). At a recent speaker evening Phil Cope from the charity came along to explain how the tools are used to empower local groups in developing countries. The groups apply for particular tools they need to undertake their work in the community. A detailed plan has to be submitted to TFSR and there is a small charge for the tools that are provided. TFSR also monitor the impact of each group to which they have provided tools. *More information on this project will be given at the meeting.* 

### **Regional Project**

Our papier mache toilet has proved very appealing – it has been used at both club events and regional events! We recently raised enough money to twin with a toilet block in Sierra Leone and President Judith has decided that this will be her chosen charity for the forthcoming year.
