We offer subsidised counseling which for the time being is free but can be charged at £5 per session. Over 300 women have benefited from our qualified councilors help. We also provide emergency funds for women who need small amounts of money when they leave a violent situation. We can direct women to the rights agency to help them and of course provide a listening ear.


Did you know? One in four women experience abuse within a relationship, many women suffer in silence and behind close doors.
