Report of Programme Action Committee 2011/12 (Extract)

AWARENESS

Contact the elderly – on 5th July 2011 Helen Ker came to talk to

the club about this charity which organises tea parties for older guests. Then on March 8th 2012 several of us attended their Open Evening in Bristol & discovered how many enthusiastic young people were volunteers.

Human trafficking – at Regional meeting in February 2012 several of us heard David Dale speak – he is a policeman on the Devon & Cornwall Police Serious & Organised Crime Team who has a special interest in Human Trafficking.

Bottled water — a small committee of dedicated Waterbabes have been advancing their knowledge of issues round water — tap & bottled - with a view to starting a campaign to encourage people to drink tap water rather than bottled — at £1/litre for bottled versus 0.01p for tap it's a no-brainer, as they say. An ongoing project — more Action next year.

Ovarian cancer – a SIGBI PA topic – our awareness campaign is just starting.
